From the Pastor's desk at Cross Lutheran Church-NALC,

“Now they were bringing even infants to him that he might touch them. And when the disciples saw it, they rebuked them. But Jesus called them to him, saying, “Let the children come to me, and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God. Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it.” (Luke 18:15-17)

It was a sunny weekend a few years ago when LuAnne and I were blessed with an opportunity to gather together and enjoy all our children and grandchildren. It was a time of playing games, enjoying food and drink, watching our grandsons throw a ball around the yard, and our granddaughters ride their bicycles in the safety of the driveway. We enjoyed sitting under the shade of the patio umbrella, having good conversations, recalling old memories, and never missing an opportunity to tease one another as we remembered most of the shenanigans we had experienced and survived through the years as a blended family. We also have different needs as a family, both as adults, and as children. One sunny afternoon, I was teasing one of our granddaughters. She was busy laughing, and we were having a great time. Then the other granddaughter impatiently said, “Grandpa...” I answered, “What do you need, honey?” She replied, “What about me?” It instantly warmed my heart when she wanted me to include her in our playing. Even though she wanted my love and attention, I also realized that I needed her love and attention just as much.

We all like to have each other's love and attention. It makes us feel accepted, welcomed, and needed. We need to be in relationships, like being a member of a family. As church members, there may be times when we feel like the church is not paying enough attention to us. As one of God's children, sometimes we can feel like God is not paying enough attention to us. Even though most days our focus is generally on our busy schedules, there are days when we realize our need for God's attention. Then we ask, “God, what about me?”

Do you think that God may ask a similar question of us? Even though we want God's love and attention, God also asks for our love and attention. “Give

As we enter the summer season of sunny weekends, where will your love and attention be directed? Will your only connection to the church this summer be through this newsletter? I pray that this is not the case. Maybe after the pandemic you feel like my granddaughter felt. “What about me? Where is my love and attention?” Joel 2:13 provides direction for you. “Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love.” Return to God’s house to listen to His Word, to receive His grace and forgiveness through the Sacrament of Holy Communion, and to worship together sharing love and attention first to God and then to our neighbor. **“Let the little children come to me...”**

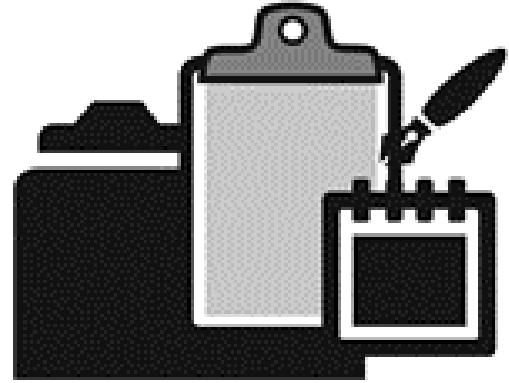

Tuesday, May 10, 2022

Church Council Minutes

The meeting was called to order by Church Council President, Matt Zimmerman, at 7:00 p.m.

Present: Matt Zimmerman, Kristy Carriveau, Nancy Schuette, Dick Koehler, Al Licht, Norm Nelson, John House, Kim Sears, Jason Shaw, and Pastor Glenn S. Sokolowski.

Guests: David Faupel and Mackenzie Roestel

DEVOTIONS: Pastor gave the devotion and opened with prayer.

AGENDA: *John House made a motion to approve the Agenda, seconded by Dick Koehler. Motion carried.*

MINUTES: Approved with correction to fish fry money. *“The balance of the \$3,846.89 profit will go into the Special Events Fund.” Jason Shaw made a motion to approve the Minutes, seconded by Nancy Schuette. Motion carried.*

GUESTS PRESENTATIONS AND REQUESTS:

Principal David Faupel reported: Last day of school is June 3; half day; closing chapel; DK/ K & 8th grade graduation. Washington D.C. Trip- 7th & 8th graders will be going in May, (5 students, 5 parents)

Day Care Director Mackenzie Roestel reported: Daycare 76 enrolled students and 41 waitlist May 26 graduations and picnic. Flooring and shelving to be put up all at once.

Matt Zimmerman, President- Nothing to report.

Kristy Carriveau, Secretary – Communications: Nothing to report.

Kim Sears, Treasurer. Reported that we’re \$3,845.24 over budget

Motion was made by Dick Koehler to accept the Treasurer’s Report as presented, seconded by John House. Motion carried.

ADVISOR'S REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT:

204 people were in attendance for Easter services

Confirmation classes done for the year, eighth graders to be confirmed October 30, 2022.

First Communion was received on 4/8/22 by Preston Braun, Emily Sturm, Cameron Schuette, and Reid Zimmerman.

Pastor will take a vacation, June 27th to July 22nd and will be absent for 7/3, 7/10, 7/17 services.

SCHOOL BOARD REPORT:

A security camera policy has been updated. Dick has amended version and will make wording correction. *Motion was made by Al Licht to accept, seconded by Jason Shaw. Motion carried.*

A six-yard dumpster costing \$140 per month was proposed, the school and daycare to split total cost. *Motion was made by Norm Nelsen to accept, seconded by John House. Motion carried.*

MINISTRIES REPORTS – TRUSTEES

Property: Alan Licht: Get quote from Booms Construction for siding, McCains installing air exchanger, Bleachers were repaired, Kneeling pads were recovered, Speaker and monitor for family room planned, Naive lighting was discussed, a quote is being gathered and will be reassessed, Replacing landscaping border, Mike Sting will head that up, A tree has been donated and planted in honor of Olga Renn's 100th birthday, Possibly gaining an additional forty feet on West side of playground to accommodate daycare needs.

A recommendation has been made that all physical improvements in the church and school going forward should be overseen before the Property Committee for approval first. *Motion was made by Dick Koehler to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented, seconded by John House. Motion carried.*

Music & Worship: John House-Nothing to report

Stewardship: Norm Nelson-Nothing to report.

Mission Outreach: Nancy Schuette-Nothing to report

Parish Life: Nancy Schuette: No meeting took place, yet coffee hours and graduation recognition will still be taken care of.

Youth: Jason Shaw: Vacation Bible School will be held the week of June 13th- 16th and youth will help with PowerPoint, bells, and ushering in the future.

OLD BUSINESS:

Property Committee school flooring proposal- we will pay final (that is minus \$2,000 discount) invoice of \$8,525.48 to avoid conflict. *Motion was made by Dick Koehler to accept, seconded by John House. Motion carried.*

Property Committee school refrigerator proposal- Mike Sting will start looking at a new refrigerator in order to get a new one here by next year. Recommend that costs would be covered by the special events fund. *Motion was made by Dick Koehler to accept, seconded Jason Shaw. Motion carried.*

Proposed wage increase for custodian- Increase of \$300 per month to hire a part time person to assist Marcine Moore. Kim Sears will speak to Phil Shadd about who is responsible for paying the increase. *Motion was made by Dick Koehler to accept, seconded by Jason Shaw. Motion carried.*

Liability Insurance for Custodian- \$450 per year for liability insurance which would cover Marcine and her subcontractor. Verbiage also needs to be added to her contract clarifying liability insurance is only provided for her, not all future custodians. *Motion was made by Jason Shaw to accept, seconded by Kim Sears. Motion carried.*

NEW BUSINESS:

School lockers- \$2,500- \$3,000 for 12 new lockers. Daycare also is looking at purchasing new lockers. Total for school and daycare would be approximately \$5,000. It could take up to sixteen weeks for delivery. *Motion was made by Dick Koehler to accept, seconded by John House. Motion carried.*

Praise and Worship Account- Account to be closed because it's inactivity and transferred to worship and music account. *Motion was made by Dick Koehler to accept, seconded by Jason Shaw. Motion carried.*

OTHER BUSINESS:

School Expansion Committee- Dick Koehler is asking for an initial meeting to be scheduled to get the conversation going.

Church Council Meeting- the July meeting has been cancelled. *Motion was made by Dick Koehler to accept, seconded by John House. Motion carried.*

Pastor to meet with daycare staff on Thursday, May 12th to minister to them.

New Church Office Hours for Summer: Church Secretary, Karen Kunisch, will be in the Church Office Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday from 9:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m.

Cemetery Committee- a new committee needs to be reorganized and cemetery plot forms updated.

Next Council Meeting – Tuesday, June 14, 2022, at 7:00 p.m.

The meeting was called to order at 5:38 by Dick Koehler. David Faupel led with prayer.

Minutes:

A motion was made by Michelle W. to approve the minutes of the Thursday, April 7, 2022, meeting and seconded by Rebecca Y. Motion carried.

Agenda:

A motion was made by Michelle W. to approve the agenda of the Thursday, May 5, 2022, meeting. It was supported by Rebecca and unanimously approved.

Guest: Guests were Pat Azarowitz and Mike Sting, representing the Properties Committee.

Treasurer's Report:

School balance: \$98,346.48

CEA balance: \$ 5,391.57

Hot Lunch balance: \$9,676.82

A motion was made by Rebecca Y. and supported by Michelle W. It was approved to accept the Treasurers' Reports.

CEA President's Report:

The Daddy/Daughter Event and the Walsh's Meat Sales were both successful. At their recent meeting, plans were made for events and fund raising for the 2022-23 school year.

Principal's Report:

Total students enrolled this year to date in 2021-2022: 63 DK-K: 18 1st/2nd: 16 3rd/5th: 17
6th/8th: 12

Projected enrollment for 2022-2023 is 71 students.

Calendar:

Grant updates:

\$1400 was received from a robotics grant that stipulated some of the money be used for coach stipend.

EANS Grant was received, for \$4000.

Arts Extravaganza will be May 19

May 22 the children will sing in church

May 27 is Family Picnic and Field Day

June 1 is Bay Shore Camp Field Day, paid for by a donor

June 3 is last day of school

Old Business:

The Robotics grant stipulates that the coach be paid from grant funds. Michelle W. made a motion to pay Mr. Faupel, the coach, \$500 plus taxes from the grant. It was seconded by Rebecca and passed unanimously.

The exterior work, purchase of new lockers, and storage shed will be discussed later after more information is gathered by the Properties Committee.

The money we had designated for Marcine to hire additional cleaning help will be paid directly to Marcine. This was approved by Church Council.

The Pigeon Library and Nietzke Faupel have been contacted to be used in the event of an evacuation. They will consult their boards and get back to us.

The security camera policy wording was amended and will be presented to the church council. The wording of who has access to the archival videos was changed from church board members to church executive board members. It will also state that there must be at least two authorized individuals to view any archival footage. A motion was made by Rebecca Y. and seconded by Kevin S. to this effect. This was approved.

The ideas for use of the \$18,000 donation were discussed. David will talk to the donor family to see if they have preferences.

New Business:

Tuition assistance was requested by a family due to unforeseen issues this year. A motion was made by Kevin S. to pay the remainder of this school year's tuition for this family. It was seconded by Rebecca Y. and unanimously approved.

The kitchen refrigerator is 22 years old. Properties Committee will be looking into cost for a new refrigerator. The school board will discuss paying a portion of the cost after we have more information.

The end of the year's Staff Pizza Party was discussed. Thank you to Caseville Small Animal Clinic for picking up the cost of the party.

The discussion of the security by the office entrance will be revisited next month.

Guests: Pat Azarovitz and Mike Sting, as members of the Properties Committee, updated us on the hallway tiles in the school. They were asking for a recommendation from the school board to support the Properties Committee requesting the council to pay the outstanding bill. The school has already paid their agreed upon portion.

Kevin S. made a motion to support the Properties Committee's resolution for the council to pay the negotiated balance of the floor tiles. It was seconded by Michelle W. and the motion was carried.

The meeting was adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer at 6:58 p.m.
