From the Pastor's desk at Cross Lutheran Church-NALC,

"Have you ever wondered if the things you do really make a difference to others?"

There was a time when I worked in an engineering department as a mechanical designer and every morning, I would greet a certain coworker as we passed each other in the narrow hallways surrounding our cubicles. "Good morning, Tim!" But he neither returned the greeting nor even acknowledged me. I was determined to not give up and for the next couple of months, I would continue to extend the same greeting. "Good morning, Tim!" But still no response. Finally, I decided that I would no longer "bother" him each morning as that was what seemed to be happening. It wasn't too long before a coworker in a neighboring cubicle came to me and said, "I was talking with Tim the other day and he thinks that you are mad at him." When I asked why, he said, "Tim said that you don't say "Good morning" to him anymore?" I couldn't help but smile!

Although it is not always possible, I try to visit the Cross Lutheran School at least once each week. I may occasionally step into a classroom to see and hear the interactions between the teacher and students. I may just walk through the lunchroom to see their expressions and hear the excited voices of the youth trying to talk over one another. Or many times, I may find myself just standing in the hallway between breaks watching the teachers tirelessly instruct their students to finish their business and line up to either return to class or prepare for recess.

When I visit the classrooms, I know that I will disrupt the class, because although I try to be quiet, there is at least one student that will see me and smile and wave. Then other students will wonder who is being waved at and see me and wave as well. Soon they are all smiling and waving!

When I walk through the lunchroom, the same thing happens. Young voices will shout out, "*Hi, Pastor Glenn*!" and then students' smile and wave. Many times, when I leave the parsonage to walk over to the church, I don't even get to the street before I hear high pitched young voices from across the playground, "*Hello, Pastor Glenn*!" I can see them waving and although I can't see them clearly, I'm sure that they are smiling.

When I am in the hallway watching the students line up, I usually will carry on a conversation with the youth and I will find out all kinds of interesting facts! I know that I can disrupt the class when I am present, but we have so much to talk about and so little time!

And when I lead Chapel, we sing together, play air guitar together, make the sign of the cross together, pray together, learn together, and praise God together... and smile together!

2023 Annual NALC Pastors' Conference in San Antonio, TX

Many members of Cross Lutheran Church may not have been aware, but the church council agreed to send me as well as my wife, LuAnne, to sunny San Antonio, Texas the first week in February for the Annual NALC Pastors' Conference. Although the temperatures in San Antonio had been previously in the 70s, we were greeted with temperatures in the lower 30s, occasional snow flurries, freezing rain, and school closings due to black ice on the roadways. Over 150 NALC pastors gathered to learn and discuss the concern of "*Reclaiming Christian Anthropology:* Gender Ideology and Our Pastoral Response." This was my first NALC Pastor's Conference and I felt that it was well worth the time and cost to attend. We were able to visit with many colleagues during our time there such as The Rev. Dr. Dan Selbo, NALC Bishop; The Rev. Dr. David Wendel, Assistant to the Bishop for Ministry & Ecumenism; and The Rev. Dr. Pastor Amy Little, NALC Financial Secretary. We also had the good fortune to spend time with Pastor Tim and Sue Loehrke and former NALC Lower Michigan Dean, Pastor Steve Hartten.





classroom has just finished Μv an interactive unit called "Discovery". It was simulation of early American a colonization. The class was divided into

four groups and the end goal was to accumulate the most wealth units. Each group had to decide why they were colonizing, pack their ship, decide where they would land, how they would interact with Native Americans and other colonies, and how their population would be assigned various jobs so their colony would survive. There was trading, attacking, farming, fishing, and hunting. Cards were drawn for each round and detailed records were kept. The cards drawn presented situations the colonists may have encountered in real life, ie: wolves ate the day's catch, winter storms prevented hunting and men were lost, farming was good and each farmer produced 25 units of food. The students also kept a journal of their day's activities. Cooperation, patience, problem solving, and common sense were life skills practiced during the unit.

Our church and school youth were all invited to participate in "FAT Tuesday" on February 21. Twenty-two youth, PS-High School, along with helpers, parents, and grandparents gathered in the sanctuary for worship and song led by Pastor Glenn. At our event we "Worship, Eat, Make, Serve, Play, and Pray". We ate pancakes, decorated donuts, created cards to be sent, made a Lenten craft, played hard, and drew names for prayer partners during Lent. Building relationships is important. It was a great time together and I look forward to more activities. Our Middle School-HS have come up with a list of activities they'd like to do and ways to serve. Please keep our youth in your prayers and look for upcoming activities!

Although we only have three and a half weeks of school during March, they are each jam packed! We will be celebrating Lutheran Schools Week with special events each day, culminating in a field trip. March is Reading Month and each classroom has set goals. Cross Lutheran School will be represented at the state robotics tournament on March 11. And, we will continue our journey to the cross during this Lenten season. Our classrooms have come up with ideas to serve with "40 Days, 40 Ways." We are looking forward to putting our faith into action.....something we should all do daily!


