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From the Pastor's desk at Cross Lutheran Church-NALC,



For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: Do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the faith God has distributed to each of you. For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member

belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully. (Romans 12:3-8)

Each year, my family doctor reminds me that it is once again time for a yearly physical checkup. With that advice, I make an appointment to visit my doctor if only for him to say that with the tests he has ordered, the results are satisfactory and I'm good for another year. I also love hearing a similar report from my dentist, my audiologist, and my ophthalmologist every six months.

I do the same for our car. Timely maintenance includes rotating the tires, changing the oil and various filters, replacing burned out light bulbs, and all the other things that may be worn and need attention. Even though all seems going smoothly at high speeds, it is at the lower speeds when I can clearly hear the murmur of a bad wheel bearing, or a squeal of worn brake pads when I step on the brake pedal. A friend once told me that a temporary remedy is to turn up the music to camouflage these sounds and early warnings! Yet if these concerns continue to be undiagnosed, they will eventually require action.


Similarly, the life of the church can seem to be going smoothly without even considering a "look under the hood." Maybe what seems to have worked in the past continues to work for the present and so it should be just fine for the future. Yet is a mindset that speaks, "if it isn't broken, don't fix it." It can also prove to be a practice for failure if annual maintenance isn't properly scheduled for unseen issues.

Like our bodies and our motor vehicles, a yearly checkup makes good sense and should be regularly scheduled for our churches. But how many times have doctor's appointments and maintenance appointments been postponed and then they are forgotten for another day? We then justify our procrastination with the reasoning, "is it really necessary?" Yes, regular maintenance can be time consuming and somewhat costly, but many times it is well worth the effort. It makes good sense and at the same time we are being good stewards of the things that bless us.

Like a phone call or a notecard that you receive in the mail as a reminder that your checkup is overdue, is this something that we should consider as stewards of Christ's Church? At the very least, should we consider having the pulse of Cross Lutheran Church checked?
