From the Pastor's desk at Cross Lutheran Church-NALC,



"In all things I have shown you that by working hard in this way we must help the weak and remember the words of the Lord Jesus, how he himself said, 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.' "(Acts 20:35)

For the past two weeks, I've been watching the squirrels outside my parsonage office window. They seem very determined in their tasks and seldom stray from their routine. I can see them traveling through the church front lawn, first stopping at the sidewalk across the street and then standing upright on their back legs as if to look both ways for traffic.

Satisfied, they cross the street and run into the lawn at the parsonage. Their next stop is to hop up on the short retaining wall that borders the shrubs in the front of the house, which is right outside my window. Again, standing on their hind legs, I can see what appears to be a huge walnut in their mouths. I often wonder if they first contemplate using the flower bed to store their food before deciding against it. On a mission, they hop down off the wall to continue their way.

Distracted from my studies, I got up and refilled my coffee cup only to sit down to see another squirrel travel from the opposite side of the parsonage yard. Retracing its path, it crossed the street and headed back across the church yard. It wasn't long before I saw three more squirrels taking the same route back and forth across the street. It is very unusual to have seen such a large number of squirrels already this morning. Yet the heavy cloud cover, the gray skies, the strong winds, along with today's cool temperatures are very unusual as well, compared to the warmer days that we've just enjoyed.

Yes, I've seen squirrels busy gathering food for the winter in past years, and a new year will only bring another season of preparation as well, but I am always intrigued by their focus and dedication in their seasonal activities. Whether they are diligently active in collecting for the future or their endless hours of trying to crack the "code" to my squirrel-proof feeder. Given enough time, it seems second nature to them that they will complete the task, whether by themselves or in a small group.

Can you think of a task or tasks that Cross Lutheran Church should be focused on for this upcoming season or even in the next year or more? Can we then dedicate our time, talents, and treasures to act on them and see them to completion?

If Cross Lutheran Church were to put a Bible verse on a tee-shirt, would it proclaim our willingness to serve with "Here I am, send me!" (Isaiah 6:8) or would it







The new school T-Shirts are being ordered. They cost approximately \$10 per child's shirt. Kevin T. made a motion to purchase a T-shirt for each child Preschool through 8th grade and give each staff member, school and day care, \$10 toward a shirt. **It was seconded by Kevin S. and approved.**

Rebecca made a motion to approve the additional school staff. It was seconded by Michelle and the motion carried.


Brian Wright- 6th-8th Grade Science Teacher

A NOTE FROM STEWARDSHIP

BUILDING FUND - A "long time ago" some members said, "Let's build a new church." "Impossible," others said "Not enough room to build, not enough money". Members got together, committees were formed, and it happened. Volunteers stepped forward to help plan, tear down, move dirt, poured cement, whatever they could to save a buck.

Then another Mission appeared—we needed a new school. Again, volunteers stepped forward to plan and help build where they were allowed to help.

Just recently another project came up. We need a new parsonage. Committees of volunteers were formed, to plan, move dirt, pound nails, paint walls, anything to save a dollar.

We are at the final stage now. All that volunteer work was greatly appreciated. The final challenge is one where everyone can help and that is to pay off the mortgage. With prayer and stewardship it can be done. Someone once said, "We've come a long way baby". Thank you to all members in the past and present. - Norm Nelson - Stewardship

PROPERTIES

It is almost fall and our committee hasn't met for two months but that doesn't mean that nothing is happening.

Many maintenance issues and other items have been completed at the school. The school is now at the age where regular maintenance is becoming a requirement. We are blessed to have a busy school with a good number of students but as with all things being used, this puts some wear and tear on the building.



The water heaters (2) were replaced in the school. One heater failed and the other was failing to supply enough hot water to the kitchen. Both were evaluated and found to be of an age where replacement made sense. Because of increased enrollment and daycare, more lockers were needed. These were purchased and delivered. The property committee installed these and they match the existing lockers quite well. The daycare room (former cafeteria) had a new floor installed to good effect. Helms Caulking has begun outside maintenance on the school and should move to the church to fix issues on that building as well. The playground was cleaned and sprayed for weeds and then covered with fresh mulch. Zimmerman Electric replaced the aging transformers in the light fixtures in the school and refurbished the fixtures with LED lighting. New projectors were installed in the classrooms. Internet equipment in the gym closet was organized and mounted on new shelving to clear floor space. Thank you to Dawn Hendricks and Hogan Halvorsen for watering our flowerpots while Rebecca delivered a beautiful baby girl. Rebecca will reassume her flower responsibilities and merits our sincere thanks. Many other issues have been dealt with but space here is too limited to list them all.

There are many issues still facing the committee. We are waiting for Booms Construction to come and finish the siding on the gym so we can have Marlette Roofing come and close out our spring-time storm damage repairs. Secondly, we are also following security issues for church and school. Discussions with Council and the School Board should yield a feasible plan that we can work toward. As always, we appreciate help with these issues. If you can assist in any way, please contact a member of the Property Committee.
