From the Pastor's desk at Cross Lutheran Church-NALC,



Once again, we hear the words, "Fall Back," and we are asked to turn our clocks back an hour to adjust for the hours of light that we receive this time of year. And once again, personal opinions and feelings will be shared about another change. There are many that would rather, "Spring Back" instead of "Springing Ahead!"

Looking back on past experiences and memories is a good way to relive what may have seemed to be the "good old days." Yes, it is an important to celebrate the things that worked well and felt seemingly right during that particular place in time but continuing to live in the past can also help us to turn our backs to the future. The concern with reliving memories is that it makes it difficult for us to "Spring Ahead," which are words that we will hear again in the Spring. Therefore, it is important to know the history in order to plan for the future, meaning that we should look forward – first understanding where we've been.

According to the Cross Lutheran Church Website: Fall of 1871, "Lutheran Synod of Michigan President Klingman makes mission tour through State to determine needs of settlers. Pastor Carl R. Boehner...would serve church at Berne." In 1888, C. Richard Praetorius (is) called as pastor of St. John's of Berne. Summer 1891, "Eight men and Pastor Praetorius decide to leave St. John's and form a new congregation at Pigeon." On August 23, 1891, the first meeting to organize Cross Lutheran Church was held.

That first church meeting was 131 years ago, and by God's grace, Cross Lutheran Church is still standing amid all of the good and the "not so good" through the years. Beginning with the called ministry of Rev. C. Richard Praetorius and continuing through the called ministries of Rev. Henry Meuser, Rev. Robert Born, Rev. Emil Richter, Rev. Ernst Henkelmann, Rev. Raymond Orth, Rev. Dellis Hudson, Rev, Joe Wold, Rev. Tom Zollman, Rev. Timothy Loehrke, and Rev. Mike Tammoria, God has, is, and will lead Cross Lutheran Church – past, present, and future.

In November of 2019, I was called to be the Pastor of Cross Lutheran Church. As you may remember, it was five short months before COVID-19 appeared and changed what we thought would never change. The doors of the church were closed, and our weekly worship services disappeared overnight. When something that we've known for a long time is taken away from us, we get angry and most times demand that it be returned. Looking back, I think that we can agree that those will not be memories of the "good old days."

When I look out upon the congregation on a Sunday morning, I can now see the faces that were once covered with face masks. Other changes are that parishioners are sitting next to each other instead of six feet apart. We are now able to reach out



and shake hands or give hugs that were once avoided. Do you remember when we didn't sing hymns during the service, but now we comfortably sing out each Sunday? Now that life is almost back to the way it used to be, we are not only content once more, but our anger and demands are quickly forgotten. We comfortably fall into the same old habits once again.

Throughout this year, I have been reading the past annual reports and newsletter articles authored by Cross Lutheran's previous pastors. They have allowed me to learn the history of Cross Lutheran Church. They have also allowed me to know the church's history in order to plan for the future, meaning that we should look forward – first understanding where we've been. The following is an excerpt from Pastor Raymond Orth's first annual report in 1974. It is also interesting to note that the average Sunday worship attendance was 292. The proposed income for 1975 is \$58,500. There is also a reminder: "to meet our budget would require: \$302.00 per family unit, \$148.00 per confirmed member.

"A significant event of the year was marked by the installation of the fifth pastor of the congregation on May 26, 1974. A change of pastors can't help but usher in many other changes since no two men on earth do the same job in the same way. Some changes have taken place. Other changes will come about. No one, however, likes change. On the other hand, anything that is alive and growing is in a constant state of change. But be assured that whenever changes do come, they will come gradually and with prior warning and instruction. We have lived as pastor and congregation for almost a year now. Hopefully trust and respect for one another has begun to grow to the point where together with Christ we can enter a new year facing its challenges and fulfilling our tasks as God's people daring to be different in Christ because we face a different day. Let the "seven last words of the church" not be spoken here: WE NEVER DID IT THAT WAY BEFORE. After all, our victorious Lord has said, BEHOLD, I AM MAKING ALL THINGS NEW. (Rev. 21:5)"

It is interesting to note that all the pastoral reports and newsletter articles mention the reality of change, and offer encouragement for the future of Cross Lutheran Church. Their message has not changed. Through the years, Cross Lutheran Church's pastors have shared that change is necessary for the continued growth of the church. Will change in our church happen as we "fall back" or will change in our church happen as we plant new seeds, and care for new growth "Springing Ahead?" Pray for Cross Lutheran Church and its ministry, and if you feel moved by the Holy Spirit, what changes will you yourself make beginning this day?

Property has been busy as usual, taking care of many small issues requiring attention. We are still waiting for Booms Construction to come and finish the siding on the gym. Marlette Roofing is also returning this fall to finish the garage roof and look at

patching some leaks on the school and church flat roofs. These issues will complete the repairs from our spring windstorm.


In addition, you may not have noticed that there are some leaks in Pastor's conference room and the storage closet at the opposite end of the hallway. These two issues as well as some evidence of leaks on the overflow wall led us to have Marlette Roofing look at the flat roof on the church. They found several locations that may be leaking. They also indicated that the general condition of the flat roof is not good. The seams are letting go and more leaks will be forthcoming. They recommend replacement of the flat roof membrane on the North and West side of the church. They will do their best, during completion of the planned work, to close the leaks with caulking to help us through the winter. This is temporary, however, and a new roof will likely be needed early next year. The Property Committee will be working with Council to budget for this major expense. Any gifts designated toward this necessary effort will be most gratefully accepted.


