From the Pastor's desk at Cross Lutheran Church-NALC,



As a young boy, our son Aaron, would not eat green vegetables. If there were “little bits of green things” in the hot dish, pizza, or soup, he would either carefully pick out each little piece or simply refuse to eat it. There were times when I would help out in the kitchen and my specialty for the evening would be soup. I had learned from my mother how to make pretty good soup from whatever was in the refrigerator or freezer. You can

imagine that no two batches of soup were identical!

If there were green peppers or green beans in the refrigerator, I would add those to the soup, too. I must admit that even though I've never followed a written recipe for my soup, it has turned out quite good, if you ask my wife and kids. Everyone around the table would enjoy the soup, no questions asked, except Aaron. “*What are those little green things in the soup?*” he would ask and then begin to pick them out. You can imagine how loved and appreciated the cook may have felt!

When I mentioned this to my mother, she told me to simply put the green vegetables in the blender, chopping them up very fine, and then add them to the soup. I tried her suggestion on the next batch of soup I made for the family, and everyone liked it, especially Aaron! I think he even had seconds!

In our journey with Christ, there are times we may decide that we just don't like something because it is new to us, or it makes us uncomfortable, or we don't think it is good for us. We decide without trying it, without sampling it, or tasting it first.

If we trust others to walk with us, gently holding our hand, encouraging and guiding us, maybe we won't be so fearful of those “little bits of green things.” Paul wrote in 1 Corinthians 3:2, “*I fed you with milk, not solid food, for you were not ready for it*”, as he continued to guide the church in Corinth toward discipleship.

What a difference from two years ago! As of Wednesday, February 9th, Cross Lutheran Church and School no longer requires the wearing of masks within its buildings. So...

Then, don't miss these opportunities to gather together for food, fellowship, and worship. Tuesday, January 11, 2022

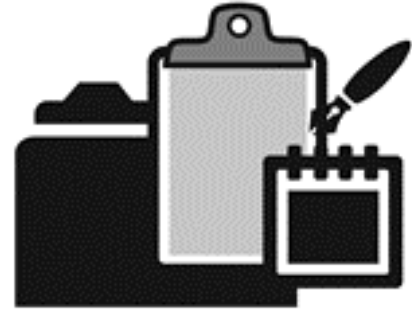
(Proposed Minutes to be approved at February Council Meeting)

The meeting was called to order by Church Council President, Michael LePage, at 5:33 p.m.

Present: Krisie Fritz, Nancy Heck, Nancy Schuette, Norman Nelson, Dick Koehler, Matt Zimmerman, and Steve Schulze.

Minutes

DEVOTIONS: Mike LePage opened the meeting with prayer.

AGENDA: Matt Zimmerman made a motion to approve the agenda with corrections by removing two items from the proposed Agenda, seconded by Dick Koehler. Motion carried.

MINUTES: Dick Koehler made a motion to approve the proposed December Minutes, seconded by Matt Zimmerman. Motion carried.

GUESTS: Mike Sting and Beth Elston gave a presentation regarding possible options for the future of the organ. Currently they are not ready to give a recommendation to council.

In other matters, Mike Sting reported on the survey for the Wednesday service. Wednesday evening services will now be addressed through the Worship and Music Committee. They are looking at creating and implementing a congregational survey for input.

Pew coverings was also addressed with Mike Sting and is below under “Old Business”.

Mike and Beth were excused at 6:14 pm.

OFFICER REPORTS:

Mike LePage, President

Mike LePage reported that the Daycare Board has recommended hiring Mackenzie Roestel who has been certified by the State and has all the qualifications to fill the position of Director. If hired, a one-year contract would be signed effective January 11, 2022, and her pay would be retroactive to January 1, 2022.

A motion was made by Dick Koehler to hire Mackenzie Roestel as the Daycare Director, a one-year contract to be signed effective January 11, 2022, and her pay to be retroactive to January 1, 2022, seconded by Matt Zimmerman. Motion carried.

Krisie Fritz, Secretary – Communications:

Thank you received from Gwynne Barry for Christmas Scrip card gift.

Nancy Heck, Treasurer – Nancy Heck gave her monthly report as presented.

Motion was made by Krisie Fritz to accept the Treasurer’s Report as presented, seconded by Steve Schulze. Motion carried.

GUESTS PRESENTATIONS AND REQUESTS:

David Faupel gave his School Report as follows:

Christmas Palooza was rescheduled for January 13, 2002. Masks are required for all in attendance. Dress rehearsals will be at 1:00 pm and 7:00 pm.

End of first semester is January 21, 2022.

Robotics tournament will be held in Lapeer on January 22, 2022.

No school on January 31, 2022, Cross is following Laker's schedule.

Basketball season will be held with rural and North Huron schools. All spectators will be required to wear masks.

David Faupel made a proposal to School Board and the board is recommending that staff members no longer need to wear a mask.

A motion was made by Dick Koehler to support the recommendation of the School Board, Steve Schulze seconds the motion for further discussion. Individual roll call was taken, and the vote was 1 yes, 7 no. Motion was defeated and will be revisited at the February council meeting.

Mackenzie Roestel gave the Early Childhood Center Report as follows:

Mackenzie Roestel reported that there have been no COVID-19 exposures.

75 enrolled

18 staff employed, interviews taking place this week

26 children on waiting list

Day Care Board is recommending coming up with a COVID-19 Testing/Quarantine room. Mackenzie reported there has been a loss of \$17,381.00 due to COVID-19 closures from September through December 2021. An individual that tests positive are sent home. If exposed and tested negative they would go to Quarantine room and continue to be tested for 5 days. Julie, Infectious Disease Specialist from Scheurer Hospital, and the Huron County Health Department approved of the Day Care plan. Testing would be done on site during a window set time. Scheurer Hospital would train someone to do the testing. Next step is for Mackenzie to make the call to the State for their approval.

A Motion was made by Nancy Heck to use the Family Room as a testing area and a quarantine room for day care, when necessary, seconded by Dick Koehler. Motion carried.

ADVISOR'S REPORTS

PASTOR'S REPORT:

Christmas Eve Worship Service: 4:00 pm and 8:00 pm

Christmas Day Worship Service: 9:30 am

Attended Worship and Music Committee meeting

Conducted a Pastoral Care and Transition Worship at Redeemer Lutheran Church, Owosso, MI

Pastor is currently in quarantine having COVID-19 and is unable to attend this meeting.

SCHOOL BOARD REPORT:

Dick Koehler wants the Ad Hoc committee that was formed to start meeting.

Dick Koehler reported that Michelle Smith has requested approval to hold a fish fry on Friday, April 8, 2022 (Friday before Good Friday). Dick Koehler will make sure the office has this on their calendar.

A motion was made by Matt Zimmerman to allow Michelle Smith to hold a drive-through fish fry on Friday, April 8, 2022, seconded by Nancy Schuette. Motion carried.

MINISTRIES REPORTS – TRUSTEES:

Property: Matt Zimmerman gave an oral report as follows:

Floor tile work that was recently done in the school is not satisfactory to the Properties Committee and will not pay the contractor until the work is corrected. Kitchen tile is satisfactory.

Still need to put dimmer in.

Music & Worship: Pew recovering update was given under “Old Business”.

Stewardship: Norman Nelson had nothing to report.

Mission Outreach: Krisie Fritz updated Council (see under Old Business).

Parish Life: Nancy Schuette questioned whether coffee hours should continue at this time or be cancelled. Discussion followed. Coffee hours will be cancelled until February 14, 2022. It will be further discussed at the next council meeting in February.

Youth: Steve Schulze had nothing to report.

OLD BUSINESS:

Church Pew Recovering – Lorraine LePage from Mission Outreach contacted the Properties Committee to see if they would be willing to assist with the hard labor of this project, and they have agreed to. Mike Sting will be responsible to line up workers and Neil Herford will oversee the project. Mission Outreach will be responsible for expenses involved with the fabric and recovering of the pews.

NEW BUSINESS:

School Security – Dick Koehler gave a presentation on a security device made by Night Lock in Michigan. Dick recommends placing the security devices on all doors. Dick and David Faupel will be attending active shooter training at Lakers.

A motion was made by Nancy Heck to order enough security devices for all doors in the school and church with the Properties Committee being responsible for installation, seconded by Norman Nelson. Motion carried.

Mandatory Mask Wearing – Cross mask policy was revisited. Discussion followed. Mandatory mask wearing for all worship services and to be revisited at each council meeting going forward. Masks will be optional for children under the age of 14. Chapel to follow church and school guidelines. One call will be utilized to contact parishioners.

A motion was made by Nancy Heck to make mandatory mask wearing for all individuals in the church and school, children under the age of 14 would be the responsibility of their parent of whether to mask their child and it would take effect starting on Sunday, January 16, 2022; seconded by Matt Zimmerman. Motion carried.

Funeral meals – Meals in the school gymnasium must be catered.

Schedule Evaluation for Pastor & Staff – Mike LePage will review this matter, David Faupel is responsible to evaluate school staff and School Board needs to evaluate David Faupel.

Annual Meeting – February 13, 2022, immediately following the service.

OTHER BUSINESS:

Dick Koehler will deliver some of the envelopes that are sitting in mailboxes. Please look to see if you can assist Dick with delivering any of the envelopes to your family, friends, and neighbors.

Next Council Meeting – Tuesday, February 8, 2022, at 5:30 p.m.

Good things around the table were shared by all.

Meeting adjourned with the Lord’s Prayer at 7:52 p.m.

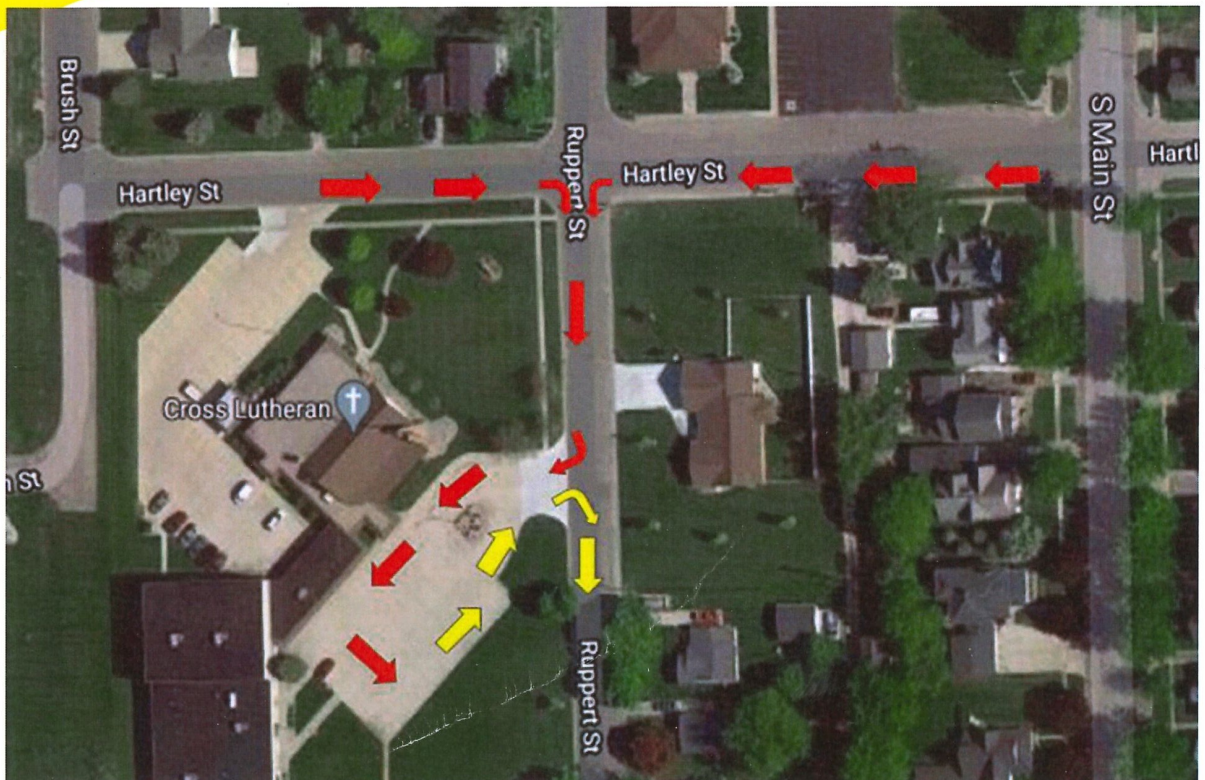

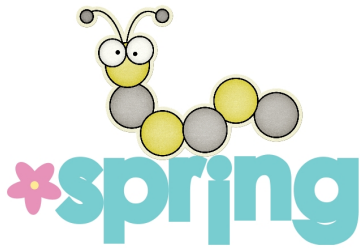
