I enjoy all the seasons here in Michigan, and when the fall weather begins to slowly move in on my summer activities, I am reminded of the need to prepare for the arrival of the next season. Transitioning from Winter to Spring and then to the Summer is quite easy, but the Fall sends a special signal that alerts us of the need to focus on things that will eventually require our attention. It is a season of preparation.

In the Spring, we gladly shed our heavy winter coats and snow boots to put them away for another year. I remember each year when the first snowflakes fell, my mother would make us wear our snow boots or "galoshes" as she would call Giving them, every time we would go outside. I couldn't wait until the

Spring when she would finally give us the okay to go outside without boots. The feeling of walking on dry ground once again made me happy and was worth the wait.

As summer arrives, the warm sun invites us to kick off our shoes, wear shorts and tee shirts, and other summer wear. Outside activities in the sun warms our bodies and tans our skin. We feel energetic. We enjoy vacation time, and family and social gatherings. If the weather cooperates, our days can be productive and our evenings relaxing before the sun begins to set.

But without warning, the wind begins to feel different, the sky displays different cloud formations, the weather may change in a matter of minutes, and the cooler temperatures in the evening hint that a light jacket may be a good thing.

The Cross Lutheran Church also experiences similar changes with each season. In the Spring, Sunday School and Confirmation classes come to an end as well as Cross Lutheran School days. Fellowship after church is put on hold. Church committees take a break. Plans for an "endless" summer are on the top of the list and the main focus for many.


Tuesday, August 9, 2022, (Pending approval at August Council Meeting)
