From the Pastor's desk at Cross Lutheran Church-NALC,



At the start of each new year, many have observed a tradition of making new resolutions as a way to "ring out the old and ring in the new." In this sense, the definition of the word, 'resolution,' is to make a firm decision to do or not to do something. Can you remember the resolutions you made around this time last year? Were you able to keep them?

I made a promise to myself last year to study my Biblical Greek at least once a week to be more fluent in my reading and speaking Koine or "common" Greek. Sounds pretty exciting, doesn't it? I did quite well with this resolution for the first two weeks of the year, but even with my best intentions, it fizzled! Looking back, I think it became difficult because I studied by myself. Studying by yourself is about as exciting as exercising and lifting weights by yourself. (By the way, exercising and lifting weights was one of my unsuccessful New Year's resolutions in the early 90s!)

For example, if you were to make a New Year's resolution to attend church worship services every Sunday for a whole year, that would be a wonderful promise! But what if you were the only one sitting in the church each week. Alone, you may do quite well the first couple of weeks, but eventually after sitting by yourself, your willpower would weaken without the support and interaction of others. Praying out loud and singing hymns may not be something that you would look forward to doing all by yourself each week.

But what if the parishioners of Cross Lutheran Church were to gather together to make just one resolution? One firm decision together that would point our enthusiasm and excitement as a church body in one direction while fueling our individual energies as the church that Christ intended. I believe through the support, interaction, and gifts we each possess, Cross Lutheran Church could follow through in "making a firm decision to do or not to do something!"

In his book, <u>God at Work</u>, Gene Edward Veith writes, "In God's design, each person is to love his or her neighbors and to serve them with the gifts appropriate to each vocation. This means that I serve you with my

David Faupel gave his School Report as follows:

- First marking period ended on Friday, November 5th.
- STEAM Day students learned different projects from the following presenters:

 - ♦ Jennie Turner, painting
 - ♦ Leanne Smith, Ukrainian eggs
 - ♦ Scott Whipple, virtual reality
- Approximately 200 shoe boxes for Operation Christmas Child were filled by Cross students on Monday, November 8th.
- Grandparents Day to be held with a chapel service on Friday, November 12th.
- Robotics tournament will be held on Friday, November 19th.
- Teachers will attend Lutheran schools teaching conference in Fort Wayne, Indiana on November 21-23, 2021. School board will cover 2 meals, expenses of 2 rooms, and will refund mileage at the federal rate. School funds will pay for the expenses incurred.
- School is providing t-shirts in the amount of \$125.00 for 5 Honor Band students.

David Faupel and Mike LePage gave the Early Childhood Center Report as follows:

- Approximately 50 children in day care.
- Mackenzie Roestel is working on her credentials and hoping to have it completed by December 1, 2021.
- Cameras needed in Day Care, exterior, gym and hallways to protect our employees, etc...No cameras in classrooms at this time. Covered cost will be covered by the Day Care. Working on additional grants of \$10,000.00 for cameras. We are still working out the details and want to be able to add on to the system later, if needed.


