Message from Pastor Mike

PRAYING FOR OUR FARMERS

May is the month when spring really gets going in a big way. March and April can be teasers, but in May the weather becomes consistently warm (or at least usually). Throughnorthern out the hemisphere farmers are plowing and fertilizing their fields, and planting the crops that will grow through the summer. In Ohio where live it's a bit Т warmer and so this planting season comes a bit earlier than in Michigan. But either way, May is the month when things are in full swing.

There is an Christian ancient tradition dating back to the fifth century called Rogation Day. ("Rogation" comes from the Latin word for "ask.") It comes on the Sundav five weeks af-Easter, ter this year May 26. The custom started in southern France after a few years of really bad harvests. The people resolved to set aside a day to pray for farmers as they planted, asking for seasonable weather. fruitful soil, and abundant crops. Their prayers were answered that year and they then beinclude to gan




such prayers in their worship on an annual basis.





This is in large credit to teacher Beth Elston, who directed the performances. A science fair presented by junior high students followed the music portion of the evening. The event was well-attended.




