My dearly beloved family of Cross Lutheran Church,

It is officially fall. For me it is a bitter sweet time. Bitter in that I keep wondering where summer went. I seem to miss it every year. Sweet because fall is my favorite time of the year. God's creation comes alive with its palate of colors splashed everywhere I look. Sunsets and sunrises seem to be more intense and breathtaking.

*NRS Genesis 1: 3*  
Then God said, "Let there be light"; and there was light. <sup>4</sup> And God saw that the light was good; and God separated the light from the darkness. <sup>5</sup> God called the light Day, and the darkness he called Night. And there was evening and there was morning, the first day.
