Message from Pastor Tim

My dear family of Cross Lutheran,

MUSIC - Beth

Next meeting is Thursday, Sept. 25



During the service, candles will be lit beginning with the Christ candle in the front of the church. The flame will continue to grow as it is passed to people standing with candles around the perimeter of the congregation symbolizing the light of God's grace and healing power to all.

There will be candles at the welcome desk, in the overflow area to pick-up before you enter the sanctuary. You may take one to join those around the congregation or you may choose to stay seated. There is no right or wrong way to participate. There will be more details and directions during the service.
