LADIES AND GENTLEMEN, WELCOME TO THE CIRCUS!!!

During the month of March, our preschool classroom was abuzz with activities centered around a circus theme.

Story books about the circus took us on fantastic adventures with clowns, tigers, acrobats and even a camel. We picked up new vocabulary words like "clown alley," "pie car," "Ringmaster," and "Big Top." Circus songs and rhymes provided happy themes for language development. Tricks like juggling, tight-rope walking, jumping through a ring of "fire" and

playing Strong Man with balloon barbells provided fun large motor practice.

For math activities, we practiced putting circus objects like clowns and lions in order according to size. We also practiced numeral recognition with balloons and counting shapes with clowns. Decorating life-sized tracings of our own bodies with all the trimmings of real clowns was a favorite art experience. Children transformed into acrobats, tigers, cats, cowboys, and a strong man by donning a variety of dress-up costumes.

Isn't it wonderful that so much learning can occur, and be so fully retained, through sheer fun and delight? I am reminded of Theodore Geisel's words in the Dr. Seuss book, *One Fish, Two Fish, Red Fish, Blue Fish*: "These things are fun, and fun is good."

Recording Church Services – We have found out that we have a license to record the church services and provide recordings to our homebound members. We will now begin looking at recording equipment. Church Garage Sale – The dates for the garage sale are June 8 – 10.

New Business: Vacation Bible School – The dates for VBS this summer are July 17 – 20. Lori reported that plans are well under way for a camping theme.
