### The Salvation of the Lord

We begin Easter Sunday with the story of the Hebrews escaping Egypt. As they approached the Red Sea, they realized that Pharaoh had changed his mind. They had nowhere to go. They couldn't go into the sea, and they couldn't return to Egypt; the only outcome for both possibilities was death. The people were afraid. They argued with Moses. Though they wanted to escape the heavy hand of the Egyptians, God's plan was frightening because it was not what they expected.

Imagine how the disciples were feeling after Jesus died on the cross. They did not know what would come next. Despite Jesus' repeated assurances, they did not know what to do. Danger surrounded them. They couldn't move forward and they couldn't go back. Their lives had changed, but now it seemed like it was over. They scattered. Some returned to the upper room, but others went into hiding or went home. God's plan was frightening because it was not what they expected.

God gave the words of hope to Moses: "Don't be afraid and watch what God can do." Moses raised his staff, the sea parted before them, and they ran for their lives. The Egyptians followed, but when the last Hebrew was safely on the far shore, Moses raised his staff and the sea closed again. By the power of God, they were saved.

The disciples waited, worried, and wondered. They grieved. They were angry and confused. How could it turn so wrong? Some thought about going home. But God said, "Fear not, stand firm, and see the salvation of the Lord." Early in the morning on the first day of the week, the women went to the tomb to anoint Jesus, but His body was gone. We know He had been raised, but they did not. Jesus' disciples were not rejoicing. The women were afraid. Mary wept. They were confused. They did not understand what was happening. Then Jesus began appearing to them. He showed them, one by one, that the promise was fulfilled. The sea was parted and those who believed in Him came out on the other side.

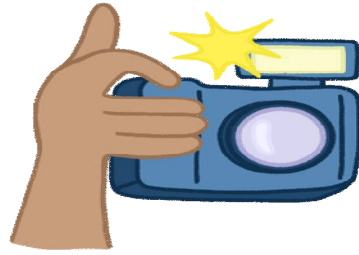

**Also in Attendance:** Pastor Kevin Kaiser, Principal David Faupel and newly elected council members Kent McKenzie and Nancy Heck.

**Agenda Update and Approval:** Motion by Delpiere, second by Sears to approve the agenda as presented. All Ayes. Motion carried.

### Review of Minutes of January Meeting

Motion by Delpiere, second by Shupe to approve the minutes of the January 13, 2026 meeting as presented. All Ayes. Motion carried.

### Pastors Report

Pastor Kaiser submitted a written report for Council to review. Format of the report may change in the coming months.

### Presidents Report

At our Annual Meeting, the Congregation reviewed and voted to approve the 3 Constitutional Amendments that were approved at the 2025 Mission Convocation. The results of the vote have been submitted to the NALC as part of the Ratification Process required by our Constitution. President Smith and Pastor Kaiser are visiting the Shut ins.

### Staff Reports

Principal Faupel reported Basketball Season is in full swing. The 7th and 8th grade Robotics team has qualified for State Competition. March 2nd thru 6th is Lutheran School Week.

### Officer Reports

Treasurer Sears submitted a written financial report for January. General Fund had a beginning balance of \$152,733.48 and a ending balance of \$154,142.01. Building Fund had a beginning balance of \$9,165.41 and a ending balance of \$12,415.41. It was noted that although the parsonage is paid for, donations to the Building Fund are still needed to fund a new Church Roof and other improvements to the Church and School. Motion by Delpiere, second by Licht to approve the Treasurers Report. All Ayes. Motion carried.

Vice President Stachowiak reported the 5 year plan committee has met several times with the following recommendations:

Prepare a listing of Church Property/Equipment and it's Life Expectancy  
Inform the Congregation of available Resources thru NALC

Form a Task Force to Unit the Church, School and Daycare  
Establish an IT Department or Committee

#### Trustee Reports

**Ministry of Worship and Music:** Trustee Trowbridge reported the Ash Wednesday Service will be February 18th at 6:30 p.m. Lenten Services are being planned for the Wednesdays of Lent at 7:00 p.m.

**Mission Outreach Ministry:** Garage sale dates are June 4th, 5th and 6th. The remaining old chairs from the overflow area will be sold at the garage sale. Plans are underway for a new church directory. Pictures will be taken August 6th, 7th and 8th. Mission Outreach and Parrish life will decorate/set up and serve the potluck dinner following Pastor's Installation on March 1st. Motion by Barry, second by Licht to pay for the meat for the dinner. All Ayes. Motion carried.

**Ministry of Youth and Education:** Trustee Barry reported a youth event has been planned for "Fat Tuesday" on February 17th. Bible Study will break during Lent and then resume on Wednesday, April 8th. Open gym continues, on Sunday from 4:30 to 6:00, thru the end of February. Spring events are being planned. The annual Cross Fish Fry will be March 20th.

**COMMUNICATIONS:** There were no communications at this time.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** The Treasurer's Report was given by Treasurer, Lorraine LePage. Lorraine reported a balance of \$8,100.78 with one check outstanding. Discussion was made in regards to the ministry's share of the bill from Zimmerman Electric. Lorraine made a motion to pay \$300 reimbursement of the bill for the church sign. Steffany Kaiser supported this motion and Tonja Nelson seconded. Motion passed. Lori Smith made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report. Tonja Nelson seconded. Motion passed.

**BUSINESS:** Krisie Janke, President, announced that \$1,272 was raised for Huron County Safe Place along with a \$30 AT&T phone card. She also announced that Lori Swartzendruber would like to get a picture with the group some time next week.

Discussion was also made in regards to Pastor's installation dinner. Kim Delpiere made a motion to have reimbursement made for the decorations for the dinner. Lori Smith seconded. Motion passed. 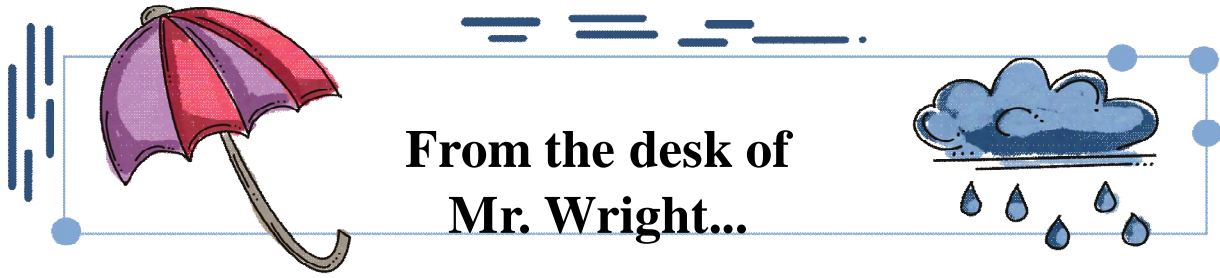

**Cross Lutheran School Board Minutes From Thursday, March 5th, 2026**

Pastor Kevin opened in prayer at 5:39 pm.

David welcomed Michelle and Matt as new members of the board.

Katie made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Matt. Motion carried. A motion to approve the January 8 meeting minutes was made by Katie and seconded by Whitney. Motion carried. No Guest presentations.

**School Treasurer's Report:**

March 1 Total Balance: \$65,173.51

There is around \$13,000 in the Safety fund. More was received from the State of Michigan than originally expected. Need to look into ways of replenishing the scholarship fund. Free/Reduced lunches come out of the scholarship fund as well.

**CEA Treasurers Report:**

Whittney reported that the Winter Dinner Auction brought in \$72,148.70. CEA balance as of 2/28/26 is \$91,519.53.

**CEA President's Report:**

Katie reported that a discussion was had about potential uses for funds raised at the Winter Dinner Auction. Options for sound-absorbing panels and other options for the gym will be looked into. Quotes and options will be presented to the CEA then brought to School Board. It was approved that the funds from the CD last year will be rolled into a new CD with an additional amount that together will equal \$15,000. This amount will be earmarked for the new roof fund. Matt is willing to donate his time to build risers for the school that can be taken apart and stored with a minimal footprint. Erica could create a CAD drawing so we have an idea of what they would look like. The cost would be much less than buying risers. Lindsay is going to talk to Mrs. Eberly about the idea of building them. Donuts with Dad will be Thursday, April 9th.

**Principals Report:**

March is reading month. The theme this year is March Madness. Lutheran Schools week was another successful week of School Spirit. There is a group of five 7th and 8th graders going to the State Competition for Robotics this weekend in Monroe. Michelle made a motion to pay for Mr. Faupel's room for the Robotics tournament. Second by Matt and approved by all. Pastor Kevin asked about the upcoming School Open House on April 9th. We are looking forward to seeing new and prospective students for next year. There are several families that have expressed interest in enrolling next year.

A concern has been brought forward that we do not store enough footage on our security system. Several different options were discussed and the decision was made to upgrade the current system to up to 24 cameras, possibly increasing the security in the church as well because the School utilizes areas in the Church. A motion was made by Katie to utilize some of the funds from the security grant to upgrade the current system at a cost of \$4786.50. This motion was seconded by Whitney and all were in favor.

The new water softener has been ordered which was funded in a reverse auction at the WDA. It will be installed during Spring Break.

A leave day donation letter was brought forward. A motion was made to approve the donation of 7 leave days from one staff member to another second by Matt and was approved by all.

Basketball Stipends were discussed. Whitney ammended her original motion to increase the coaching stipend to a total amount of \$1,700, which will be distributed to the 3 coaches for the season. The total amount will be taken from the Annual Fund. This motion was seconded by Matt and approved by all.

An additional vacuum is needed for cleaning. The CEA approved purchasing the vacuum which will cost around \$1,000.

Walmart grocery delivery is going to be looked into. Michelle made a motion to approve asking Marcine if this is something that would help minimize trips to Bad Axe. Whitney seconded the motion and all were in favor.

T-Mobil has made an offer to purchase the FCC license instead of leasing it from us. The money currently goes into the Computer fund. Many questions were brought forward including what this change would entail. Currently we are in a 30 year lease and are about 10 years in. The decision was made to table the topic and take it to Church Council for discussion before any further discussion.

### **5 Year Goals/Plans**

Kevin reported that the committee met and they are asking the School to do a few things: first of which is to form a task force/committee to help form cohesion between Church/School/Daycare. The ideal members would be Pastor Kevin, School Board President, Principal, Daycare Director, Daycare Board Representative. Church/School/Daycare logo unification: discussed the options of the same logo but with unique wording. There is a 5 year plan for the School and also for the Church as well.

Motion to adjourn by Katie at 7:10pm. Second by Whitney. Motion carried.  
We closed the meeting with the Lord's Prayer

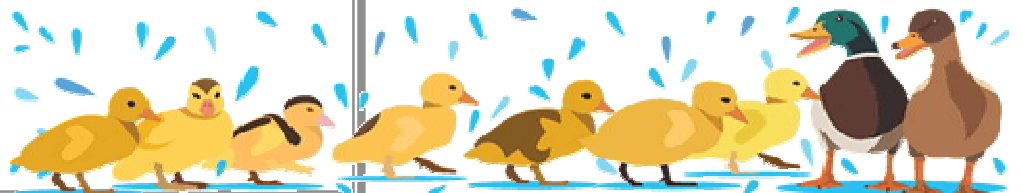

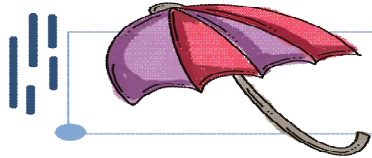
