My dear family of Cross Lutheran,

The long wait is over. The harvest is upon us. The near drought conditions of last June / July brought on doubt and anxiety on whether there was going to be a harvest, garden, flowers, green grass, and plants. The wait is over. There is a harvest. There are gardens. There are flow-The grass turned green and plants came alive. The wait is over. Thank you God!!!

I truly wish God would have given me the gift of patience, comfort, and relaxation in my waiting. I must be the only one that has a hard time with waiting. Waiting for spring and summer of 2013 knowing I have to go through winter first. Waiting, waiting, waiting. In the Coast Guard it was hurry up and wait. In raising children, it was waiting for them to be able to walk and then go to school, then to get through those teenage vears, and then finally become adults. I feel like my life is a perpetual state of "waiting."



# CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES - unapproved

## August 14, 2012

CALL TO ORDER: The monthly meeting of the Cross Lutheran Church Council was called to order by president, Richard Koehler, Jr., at 7:04 p.m., on the above date. Members present Fritz. Karen were Mike Schuette, Paul Schuette, Nancy Heck, Tom Shupe, John Smith, Lori Smith, Aileen Prill, Krisie Fritz, and guest, Carol Diener. Tom Shupe opened the meeting with prayer.

AGENDA: Agenda for the evening was presented to all present. Motion was made by Tom Shupe to approve the agenda as amended under Old Business, #3 was added-Adopt a Highway Date - Aileen Prill, and under New Business, #2 was added-Transfer - Arlene & Joe Wold from Cross to Peace Lutheran Church, Texas, and under next council meeting should read Tuesday, September 11, 2012; seconded by Nancy Heck. Motion carried.

MINUTES: The previous Coun-

cil Minutes dated July 10, 2012, were reviewed by all present. A motion was made by Karen Schuette to approve the minutes as presented, John Smith seconded the motion. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Copies of the Treasurer's report were distributed to all present by Nancy Heck. Nancy Heck reported that the General Fund had income of \$24.764.37 for the month of and expenses Julv. \$24,023.24. The General Fund balance segmented, includes Leaf Fund \$757.59, Capital Improvement Fund 18,645.14, Organ Repair Fund \$7,300.00, General Operating Fund has a Negative Fund Balance of \$10,829.86 and the Cemetery Perpetual Care Fund has balance of \$10,375.00. Discussion was held regarding the extra monies in the Building fund. Tom Shupe made a Motion to take \$10,000.00 from the Building fund directly to pay down the mortgage, discussion continued. Karen Schuette seconded the Motion, Motion carried. Tom Shupe made a Motion to accept the treasurer's report, seconded by Mike Fritz. Motion carried.

**FINANCIAL SECRETARY REPORT:** Paul Schuette provided his report to all present. His report covered the period of 1/1/2012 through 8/11/2012, and it showed Total Contributions for the Gen-

eral Fund were \$166,017.91 which is \$22,190.61 under budget.

COMMUNICATIONS: Krisie Fritz read a letter from Arlene & Joe Wold, requesting a transfer from Cross Lutheran Church to Peach Lutheran Church, 1147 S. Walnut Avenue, New Braunfels, TX 78130. Tom Shupe made the motion to allow the above transfer, seconded by John Smith. Motion carried.

Dick Koehler received a letter from the Endowment Board of Trustees requesting that council continue to have Carol Diener as our investment advisor, and temporarily disband their board until the endowment fund reaches a higher level and/or eliminate our committee due to the financial situation of Cross and since the ultimate control of the money lies with Church Council. Discussion was held and questions answered by Carol Diener. It was decided after discussion that this matter should be turned over to the Stewardship Committee for research as to what our By-Laws state. 
