Message from Pastor Tim

Lessons from the Henhouse After I retired, I hinted to my husband that I wanted to keep some chickens. For Mother's Day, he bid on, and bought me a ramshackle chicken coop at an auction. Before its windows were replaced, its screen door repaired and the whole thing given a new coat of buttery yellow paint, I ordered baby

chicks from an on-line hatchery. The babies arrived at just 2 or 3 days old, having survived the trip in a cardboard box with no sustenance except that which nature had provided for their early existence. I was completely enchanted with them; I nurtured and loved them, changed their water frequently, ensured that they had grain in abundance, tidied their little home, tenderly held them, and simply watched them. They had grown measurably each day, their soft, downy feathers changing to adult plumage in a spectacular range of colors and patterns. They had identities such as "Golden-Laced Wyandotte", "Plymouth Rock", "Easter Egger" (who laid beautiful blue and green eggs), and "Welsummer".

Soon they were ready to move from potting shed to the now restored henhouse. By the age of 6 months, they were presenting me daily with a beautiful assortment of eggs—speckled, light brown, dark brown, large, double A types and tiny white ovals of protein in a shell. I stood in awe that God in his incredible creativity had designed such lovely creatures, who asked so little, offered so much in so many ways, (especially conversationally),

were dressed in such beautiful array and gave me daily their very best offering. I cannot think of that flock or those who have been added since that first batch without marveling at God's love for us and His provision for our health and even entertainment in the form of chickens. walk.

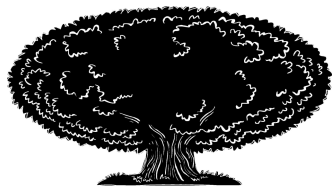
