July 12, 2011

CALL TO ORDER: The monthly meeting of the Cross Lutheran Church Council was called to order by acting president, Richard Koehler, Jr., at 7:01 p.m., on the above date. Members present were Karen Schuette, Lorraine LePage, Krisie Fritz, Kevin Trost, Paul Schuette, Ray Licht, Terry Sturm, Mike Fritz, and Nancy Heck. Guests present were Betty Champagne. Paul Schuette opened the meeting with prayer.

MINUTES: The previous Council Minutes dated June 14, 2011, were reviewed by all present. A motion was made by Nancy Heck to approve the minutes, Ray Licht seconded the motion. Motion carried.

AGENDA: Agenda for the evening was presented to all present.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Copies of the Treasurer's report were distributed to all present by Nancy Heck. Nancy Heck reported that the General Fund had income of \$26, 243.41 for the month of June and expenses of \$28,213.90. The General Fund balance, segmented, includes Leaf Fund - \$1,129.49, Roof Repair Fund - \$3,695.14, Organ Repair Fund - \$7,300.00, General Operating Fund as a Negative Fund Balance of \$6,684.63, and the Cemetary Perpetual Care Fund has a balance of \$8,475.00. At this time the General Operating Fund is borrowing from the other funds, rather than using the bank line of credit. Ray Licht makes a Motion to accept Nancy's report, seconded by Karen Schuette. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY REPORT: Paul Schuette pro-

vided his report to all present. His report covered the period of 1/1/2011 through 7/16/2011, and it showed Total Contributions for the General Fund were \$141,985.63, which was \$666.40 over budget. Other monies received to date were as follows:

A Motion was made by Terry Sturm to accept Paul's financial report, seconded by Mike Fritz. Motion carried.


