November 8, 2011

CALL TO ORDER: The monthly meeting of the Cross Lutheran Church Council was called to order by acting president, Richard Koehler, Jr., at 7:02 p.m., on the above date. Members present were Pastor Timothy Loehrke, Karen Schuette, Krisie Fritz, Kevin Trost, Paul Schuette, Lorraine LePage, Mike Fritz and Nancy Guests present were Heck. newly elected council members, Lori Smith and John Smith. Pastor Loehrke opened the meeting with prayer.

MINUTES: The previous Council Minutes dated October 11, 2011, were reviewed by all present. A motion was made by Nancy Heck to approve the minutes, Kevin Trost seconded the motion. Motion carried.



A Message from Aaron Shupe

Flashlights Needed

Sheer blackness.

I blink.

Eyes wide open, I intensely stare, even squint.

Still nothing and completely dark.

Really?! Absolutely nothing?

Yep, nothing.

Though I obviously cannot see them, the narrow walls of the natural-formed cave seem narrower, the pointy stalactites and stalagmites loom around me as invisible teeth and spikes. Thanks to gravity, I'm pretty sure what direction up and down are, but that is pretty much it. A heavy lump of fear or concern should be forming in my gut, but to be honest, its not. I know what is in my hand.

Without much thought, I clumsily push the button of the little cylinder-shaped object. Zap! As simple as that, the zigzagging tunnel is transformed into a dazzling wonder. I immediately regain my sense of direction, choose the correct tunnel to navigate, and continue on my way out.

What if I did not have my flash-light?

Seriously.

Think about it.

What if I really did not have a flashlight? What if I had wandered into this cave in darkness (cliffs and all!) and had to find my own way without a light? A big problem. A hopeless problem. A life-threatening problem. In a very real way, this is our situation without the Word of God. Without the Word is darkness and death.

John1:1-5 "In the beginning was the Word, and Word the was with God. and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him and without him was not any

thing made that was made. In him was life and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it." John 1:1-5 ESV

And so is the situation of spiritual darkness in Guinea as the Fulani wander without the Gospel. So many people, generation after generation without the light. But God has not forgotten them. Already, throughout many areas where we've already been, God's Word, little bits of his light, can be found.

Once again I am humbled to be able to be part of God sharing his light and 'spiritual flashlights.' This winter, I've been invited to join in on trekking this dry season from 20 Dec until the beginning of March.

Since trekking last winter I've continued to work with my brothers on the farm in Michi-

gan and also travel some too. The spelunking story actually comes from my visit last week with my brother Andrew in New Zealand.

As for long term plans for myself, I'm still deciphering God's call on my life, planning for sure to do missions, but still prayerfully considering the details.

I invite you to join in on this ministry holding the Fulani, myself, and the Hoflands (the family I'm working with,) up in prayer.

Some particular prayer requests:

-Health and safety as quite a bit of difficult traveling will be involved

-For Fulani who are searching for truth, that they would find it in the Word

-Direction for what areas and villages we should go for trekking

-Continued open doors from leaders.

-That I'd be able to recall and deepen language

Its so great to be writing a letter like this again, I look forward to sharing glimpses of what God is doing, and maybe even hear a 'hey' from you. Thanks so much for being part of this.


