
<sup>NRS</sup> **Matthew 24:36** "But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father.

MINUTES November 13, 2012

**CALL TO ORDER:** The monthly meeting of the Cross Lutheran Church Council was called to order by vice-president, John Smith, at 7:05 p.m., on the above date. Members present were Pastor Timothy Loehrke, Karen Schuette, Paul Schuette, Nancy Heck, Tom Shupe, Aileen Prill, John Smith, and Krisie Fritz. Pastor Loehrke opened the meeting with prayer.

**MINUTES:** The previous Council Minutes dated October 9, 2012, were reviewed by all present. A motion was made by Nancy Heck to approve the minutes as presented, Aileen Prill seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**AGENDA:** Agenda for the evening was presented to all present. Motion was made by Karen Schuette to approve the agenda as written, seconded by Tom Shupe. Motion carried.

#### GUEST PRESENTATIONS/ REQUESTS: None

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Copies of the Treasurer's report were distributed to all present by Nancy Heck. Nancy Heck reported that the General Fund had income of \$28,288.87 for the month of October, and expenses

of \$32,454.56. The General Fund balance segmented, includes Leaf Fund \$757.59, Capital Improvement Fund 11,770.14, Organ Repair Fund \$7,300.00, General Operating Fund has a Positive Fund Balance of \$3,091.13 and the Cemetery Perpetual Care Fund has a balance of \$10,900.00. Krisie Fritz made a Motion to accept the treasurer's report, seconded by Tom Shupe. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY **REPORT:** Paul Schuette provided his report to all present. His report covered the period 1/1/2012 through of 11/03/2012, and it showed Total Contributions for the General Fund were \$221,300.04, which is \$29,644.65 under budget. Paul also informed council that he has the order form for the envelopes. Paul questioned if there were any changes before he orders. Tom Shupe made a Motion to change envelope from Mission Festival to OCC-shoebox envelope. John Smith seconded the Motion. Motion carried.
