
## Message from Pastor Tim

My dearest family of Cross Lutheran,

What abnormal weather for winter. It's the end of January and the temperatures are above normal, there is no snow on the ground, no complaint here about that, and we are experiencing a lot of rain. It is the topic of most conversations now a days.

However, the weather condition that seems to be effecting everyone is the number of days without sunshine. Why is that? In one word, FOG!! It has been a long time since the sight of blue sky and sunshine has graced our skies. Cloud cover and especially fog have been the norm for a long time. It is getting to the point that people are really getting grumpy all because clouds cover the sun. It's amazing how much the sun has an effect on our attitude and outlook on life which in turn effects our treating of other people.

While in the Coast Guard and sail-



ing the Great Lakes on one of my ships, we encountered many times a weather condition called "sea smoke." This condition is just like fog but on the water. It rises from the water until it reaches a height above water and then the fog dissipates. So a condition of "sea smoke" of 20 feet high can exist from the water up and then above that is clear blue skies. During one of these times in sea smoke and standing on the bridge of the ship, I couldn't even see the water yet I looked up and saw clear blue skies and a sea gull gliding along without a care in the world.

The fog we are in today reminds me about what life is all about. Our lives are but fog to us and we grope along trying to find our way out.

NRS **Psalm 139:** 9 If I take the wings of the morning and settle at the farthest limits of the sea, 10 even there your hand shall lead me, and your right hand shall hold me fast.

11 If I say, "Surely the darkness shall cover me, and the light around me become night,"

12 even the darkness is not dark to you; the night is as bright as the day, for darkness is as light to you.

In trying to find our way out we look inward to ourselves "knowing" that we have the answers to all those life situations that constantly put us in the "fog" of life. In so doing, life decisions are made based on what we want which in turn makes the "fog" of life (Cont. on Pg. 2)
