By now most of you have heard that Sunday, on Dec. 17, I announced my retirement and submitted my letter of resignation to the call of Word and Sacrament Cross to Evangelical Lutheran Church and School. My last Sunday will be June 10, 2018. My last official day will be Friday, June 15. 2018.

Sue and I will be moving closer to our granddaughters who live in Howland, OH which is just north of Youngstown, OH.

I have been in discernment with

the NALC Bishop, Assistant Bishop, and the Dean of the North Eastern Ohio Mission District (NEOMD) and other pastors as to my retirement intentions. From the Desk of ... Beth Elston

Routine is important for children. In fact, it is one of the foundations of an Early Childhood program. In the preschool, the daily schedule is carefully planned to ensure that students have the best environment for success.

Our daily schedule provides a flow for the class day. It provides a balance of intensity with informal and relaxing times. It requires times of teacher directed activities and child directed activities, so that students are both receiving input and engaging in output in the form of experimentation and practice in a variety of activities.

A consistent routine through a good daily schedule provides

many benefits for children. Because routines are established and internalized by students, they have security in knowing what will happen next, when it will happen, and how it happens through familiar procedures. This familiarity functions as a normalizing factor in their lives; that is, it provides a framework of usual and comfortable happenings, which can be very helpful when there are interruptions, changes and perhaps anxious situations that may be a challenge for them. Routines also establish boundaries within which children have space to explore, learn and create. Ultimately, consistent routines help children develop their own ability to monitor them own minds and emotions.

Routines, then, need not be a burden. Rather, they are a blessing of comfort and stability. Remember the words from Ecclesiastes chapter 3: For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven. (NRSV)
