Message from Pastor Tim

My dear family of Cross Lutheran Church,

It's hard to believe that Lent is here and Holy Week is just around the corner. Where has the time gone? Do you find yourself trying to just keep one step ahead of the "game?" Do you find yourself being pulled in four different directions at the same time? Do you find yourself saving at the end of the day 'there just isn't enough time in the day to accomplish everything!'? Do you find that tomorrows schedule is worse than what you went through today?

When all of that happens and you are just at the end of your rope and feel like everything is out of control, ask yourself these questions; whose demands are creating my schedule e.g. kids, work, friends, relatives, spouse, etc? there enough time in my day to meet all of those demands? Am I accomplishing all of my personal demands in my life; e.g. quiet time, cooking, working out, enjoying my hobby, etc? Am I trying to be the super person and please everyone and the demands they put on

me? I have a hard time the saving no. ls schedule driven bν someone else's schedule and does that have a priority over everything I do? I've got to get my life under control, but how?

NRS Luke 10: 38 Now as they went on their way, he [Jesus] entered a certain village, where woman а named Martha welcomed him into her home. 39 She had a sister named Mary. who sat at the Lord's feet and listened to what he was saying. 40 But Martha was distracted by her many tasks: so she came to him and asked, "Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me to do all the work by myself? Tell her then to help me." 41 But the Lord answered her. "Martha, Martha, you are worried and distracted by many things; ⁴² there is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her."

How do you get vour life under control? Turn to the schedule

that Jesus Christ has for you. Set Jesus Christ's schedule as the one and only schedule you will follow. How is that done? Set Jesus Christ as number one in your Wake up in the morning and say thank you Jesus for the night of restful sleep. Reveal to me today the glory of your grace and may all that I do be for the glory of what you did for me on the cross.

Let t h e "demands" of Jesus Christ drive your schedule. When you do, there will come times when vou will have to say no. There will come times when you will have to say 'it doesn't fit into my schedule.' There will come times when those who are making demands on you will become frustrated and, ves, even be angry with vou because your priorities are what Jesus Christ wants you to do and not what they want you to do. FROM THE DESK OF ... DEB MUSOLFF

Reading well is the key to success in all subject areas. Students who do not learn to read by the end of second grade will need intervention in the intermediate grades and are likely to

struggle with reading throughout their lives. As a parent you should want the very best early education for your children.

Our school uses a reading program called Superkids.
Superkids, a comprehensive reading and language arts program designed just for kindergarten, first, and second grades, was created by Pleasant Rowland, founder of the Rowland Reading Foundation. The goal of the Superkids Reading Program is to produce skillful, confident readers and writers.

The foundation for building SUPER readers happens before a child even attends school. Listed here are some important tips for parents to help pre-school aged children and to continue with your children when they reach school

age:

- Talk often to your child to build listening and speaking skills, and to develop vocabulary.
- Play alphabet and word game and for young children sing songs and say nursery rhymes.
- Read to your child often and talk to him about words and ideas in books. For a young child point out the book's features. Such as the front and back, the title, author's name, where to begin reading, and picture details.
- Listen to your child read.

Encourage your child to write.

MINUTES

January 8

CALL TO ORDER: The monthly meeting of the Cross Lutheran Church Council was called to order by President, Richard Koehler, at 7:03 p.m., on the above date. Members present were Pastor Timothy Loehrke, Karen Schuette, Paul Schuette, Nancy Heck, Tom Shupe, Aileen Prill, John Smith, Lori Smith, Gretchen Roestel, Neil Herford and Krisie Fritz. Pastor Loehrke opened the meeting with with prayer.

MINUTES: The previous Council Minutes dated December 11, 2012, were reviewed by all present. A motion was made by Tom Shupe to approve the minutes as presented, Aileen Prill seconded the motion. Motion carried.

AGENDA: Agenda for the evening was presented to all present. Pastor asked to amended the Agenda to add under New Business - #2 - Outreach Mission. Motion was made by Nancy Heck to approve the agenda as amended, seconded by John Smith. Motion carried.

The General Fund balance segmented, includes Leaf Fund \$413.59, Capital Improvement Fund 8,475.14, Organ Repair Fund \$7,300.00, General Operating Fund has a Fund Balance of \$6,021.05 and the Cemetery Perpetual Care Fund has a balance of \$11,500.00. Tom Shupe made a Motion to accept the treasurer's report, seconded by Krisie Fritz. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY RE-PORT: Paul Schuette provided his report to all present. His report covered the period of 1/1/2012 through 12/31/2012, and it showed Total Contributions for the General Fund were \$279,027.39, which is \$17,543.61 under budget.
