Therefore we will not fear, though the earth


should change, though the mountains shake in the heart of the sea; ³ though its waters roar and foam, though the mountains tremble with its tumult.

From the Desk of ... Beth Elston

Now that the weather has turned colder, we are all spending more time indoors. It is easy to turn to electronic media of various types to occupy our time, but remember that children, especially, need physical activity, and lots of it! Children are literally building neural con-

nections which are essential for learning throughout their lives, and nature's way of doing this is 4.
