## Message from Pastor Tim

The recent rescue of the 33 trapped miners in Chile is truly a remarkable feat of epic proportions. It is a testament to what the human body and spirit can endure under extremely hostile and, at times, seemingly hopeless conditions. These miners were trapped by no fault of their own, but none the less trapped "deep in darkness." The only way they survived and were able to be rescued was by the proactive care of those on the surface "in the light" banning together for one single cause; save and free those who were trapped.

Have you ever felt trapped? Have you ever found yourself trapped at work where you felt you can no longer climb the ladder of promotions and that is as far as you can go within the company? Have you ever questioned yourself about what you are doing with your life saying; " I don't like what I'm doing, I'm getting up in age however, I need to keep this job because I need the income to eat and pay the bills. I'm trapped!" Or have you found your-
self trapped within a relationship that just seems like there's no way out? We adults are trapped in many different ways and seek out solutions that seem to be that quick fix "silver bullet" that will make life grand. However, it seems like we just go into another trap.

Being trapped, however, is not only reserved for adults. Children from elementary school through high school are trapped in their own lives. They are trapped by bullying in school, abusive home life, trying to out do the other person to obtain a high social popularity status, etc. Their remedy, or fix, for all of that is the same as they mimic what the adults do, drugs, alcohol, destructive relationships. recently attended a presentation about children within Huron County and the "state" in which they are in. What I heard is alarming! 1 of $107^{\text {th }}$ graders has considered suicide. 1 of $107^{\text {th }}$ graders has used alcohol within the last 30 days. $62 \%$ of high school students
have been drunk by the age of $14.25 \%$ have used marijuana or harder drugs. $65 \%$ have had sexual intercourse before they graduate from high school. (Statistics taken from 2009 MiPHY Survey \& Michigan Dept. of Human services.) They are in darkness!

These children, and yes they are children, are screaming for help. They are screaming at the top of their lungs to anybody or anything that will help comfort their stresses and make them feel loved. It seems like the only thing listening to them and "helping" them is worldly solutions that in reality only bring more stress and problems. My question is; where is the church? Where are those who are "in the light", rescuing these children who are trapped in darkness? I have heard many people say it's terrible what is happening to our children these days but I see very little done to rescue them.

"screaming" for help from our children and be proactive. We need to be like those on the surface "in the light" who came together to rescue those Chilean minors who were trapped in the deep darkness of the earth. Our children, now more than ever, need to be rescued from the deep darkness of their trapped lives and hear the "silver bullet" that will give them hope and peace of mind in all of their struggles that will rescue them and set them free. We need to develop relationships with these children so they, as well as us adults, hear and live the words of hope and freedom that Paul wrote to the Colossians;

MRs Colossians 1: 11 May you be made strong with all the strength that comes from his (God's) glorious power, and may you be prepared to endure everything with patience, while joyfully ${ }^{12}$ giving thanks to the Father, who has enabled you to share in the inheritance of the saints in the light. ${ }^{13} \mathrm{He}$ has rescued us from the power of darkness and transferred us into the kingdom of his beloved Son, ${ }^{14}$ in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

We need to be God's church that wakes up and hears the cries of our children and take action. We need to be God's church that commits itself to the work of being involved in our chil-
dren's lives. We need to be God's church that cares about our children through our actions. We cannot be a church who sits in the pews every Sunday, pat our selves on the back and say how good we are while children are crying for help and do nothing.

Please pray about how you can become involved with God's children whether you have children or not. The lives of junior high and senior high school children are waiting to hear from you.
