Message from Pastor Tim

My dearly beloved family of Cross Lutheran Church and School,

The days are getting longer. That is what I always told my kids when they were young and they always say "sure dad" just to please this old man. However. the days are getting longer. The winter solstice, Dec 21, the shortest day of the year, has come and gone which means the sun is agonizingly, and with great reluctance, rising in the sky and each day the sun sets a little later in the evening. What great joy! Spring is almost here! Ok, we still have January, February and March to go through, however we are getting closer to spring.

Sun light, or the lack there of, plays an important part of our human lives. When the sun is out and all is clear, all has been made visible, the sense of direction is at its peak and a clear and present sense of security surrounds us. However, when the sun light is gone, darkness sends its shrouded vale over all of that and we become disoriented. The sense of security is replaced by doubt and fear of what cannot be seen.

We rely on what we think we know and past experiences to grope through the darkness in the false sense that we can get through even the darkest of the darkest. Yet, we discover, and painfully so, that the darkness continues and goes and goes.

Our spiritual lives are an exact replica of all the above. When we are in the "Son" light i.e. Jesus, everything is clear, everything is as it should be and everything is peaceful and jovful. However, when temptation i.e. Satan, brings another "way" to peace and joy, the "vale of darkness" i.e. sin, overcomes us, we look inward to our sinful selves for the "Son" light to guide us out of the darkness of sin. Yet, the deeper we look within us, the darker our lives become. For Satan makes his darkness seem so comfortable in that no one can see the sin we commit. No one gets hurt because it is so dark we cannot see the pain we are causing with our sin. We do not see the ripple effect in others who love us yet we hurt without even knowing it.

^{NRS} John 3: ¹⁹ And this is the judgment, that the light has come into the world, and people loved darkness rather than light because their deeds were evil. ²⁰ For all who do evil hate the light and do not come to the light, so that their deeds may not be exposed.

Then comes that moment when we are so deep in our darkness, so complete in despair and hopelessness of ever seeing the sun light again, we come to the realization that the true light to seek is the light from the "Son."

MINISTRY OF STEWARD-SHIP: Norm was present and provided his oral report. The budget proposal was passed by the congregational vote during the annual meeting.

MINISTRY OF WORSHIP AND MUSIC: Barb was present and provided her oral report. They are looking at purchasing 30 used green hymnals and 100 used blue hymnals. They are going to have organ music, without singing, during communion to encourage prayer and contemplation after receiving communion.

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION: Kim presented her oral report. There was no meeting this month.

MINISTRY OF MISSION OUT-REACH: Loraine presented her written report to all present. For Operation Christmas Child, next year, they will only use the standard, pre-printed shoeboxes. Eleven boxes of food were delivered to the Pigeon Food Pantry. All tags have been taken from the Giving Tree, meaning that 25 area children will have a merry Christmas.

MINISTRY OF PROPERTY: Eric was present and provided his oral report. We are looking at replacing the spot lights in the front of the church with LED lights to reduce the heat generated by the lights and to save electricity. Mission/Outreach Ministry

November 29

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 p.m. by our new Chairman, Lorraine LePage, who opened the meeting with a reading and prayer. Those present were RoseAnn Budnick, Connie Krisie Fritz, Lorraine Eden. LePage, Kay Schuette, Bonnie Schulz, Lori Smith, Gwen Ovcen and Pastor Tim. Lorraine thanked Lori for her years of service as Chairman. The minutes of the October 25, 2016 meeting were read and approved. The treasurer reported \$3,714.36 in the checking account. A thank you note was read.

Old Business: Operation Christmas Child Shoebox Review: On November 17, 689 boxes were packed for OCC. Lori reported that she used her personal credit card to pay for shipping on four boxes (\$28) in order to track them. Gwen made a motion that Lori be reimbursed for the tracking. Kay seconded the motion, and the motion carried. The total cost of shipping 689 boxes at \$7 per box would be \$4,823. There is no grand total of donations received from the church collection vet. Lorraine reported that a donation will be coming from Thumb National Bank and TNB employees. Lorraine had a conversation with Cindy Parsons from Bay Shore Camp the night of the shoebox packing. It was noted that 24 standard sized shoeboxes normally fit in a shipping carton. However, due to the larger size of some of the shoeboxes used, not as many fit in some of the cartons. We discussed the possibility of having Cindy Parsons and her husband come to speak at our kick-off service next fall. Bonnie made a motion, seconded by Krisie, that for next year we only purchase the preprinted OCC shoeboxes or stackable plastic shoeboxes, and

that we no longer use donated shoeboxes. Lorraine will send an email out to the churches to put in their bulletins that we are thankful for past donations of shoeboxes, but that we will no longer be using them. The Mission Outreach ministry thanks all the volunteers who helped in any way with the shoebox ministry this year. Pigeon Food Pantry: On November 26, eleven boxes of food and other items were packed and delivered to the Pigeon Food Pantry. Cross Giving Tree: All the tags have been taken from the tree, which means that 25 area children will have a merry Christmas. All the gifts are due back at the church by Sunday, December 4. Shut-Bonnie reported that she ins: sent Thanksgiving cards and will also be sending out Christmas cards and gifts to our shut-ins. November/Thanksgiving Decorating: Clean-up changes for next year were discussed.

New Business: Secretary and Treasurer positions: Connie will remain as secretary and Lori will remain as treasurer. 2017 Mission Outreach Events: Some ideas were shared and we will discuss them more at the next meeting. It was decided to cancel our December meeting.

Scrip Cards will be sold December 4, 11 and 18. The schedule is as follows: Dec. 4 – RoseAnn; Dec. 11 – Connie; Dec. 18 – Bonnie. January schedule is: Jan. 8 – Krisie; Jan. 15 – Lorraine; Jan. 22 – Kay; Jan. 29 – Bonnie.

Our next meeting will be January 24, 2017. The meeting was adjourned with all saying the Lord's Prayer.
