Message from Pastor Tim

My dearly beloved family of Cross Lutheran,

WOW!!! Where did the summer go? It was just "yesterday" that school finished and things were to slow down. Yet, school has been in session for a week and the "hectic" life of the church and school are in full swing again. When was there time to refresh, rejuvenate and refocus for the new "season"?

Last July at the NALC Convocation in Charleston, SC, Bp Bradosky once again reminded all of us about the mission of the NALC; make disciples of Jesus Christ. This is based on the great commission found in Matthew 28,

From the Desk of David Faupel ...

Last May, my 7th and 8th grade students and I were blessed with the opportunity to visit Washington, D.C. and Gettysburg on a five-day trip. We journeyed by bus (it seemed like a sleepless journey for me) with four other local Lutheran schools: St. John's, Port Hope; Christ the



King, Sebewaing; Zion, Harbor Beach and Trinity, Reese.

My students had a blast! Some of the sites we visited on the trip included the battlefield at Gettysburg, presidential and war memorials, Arlington National Cemetery, the Capitol building, National Cathedral,

Holocaust Museum, Smithsonian Air and Space, and Mount Vernon.

Students also got to experience a military pageant, which included the U.S. Army Drill Team. There was SO much to see in such a limited amount of time, and everyone was exhausted by the end of each day.

Though it is difficult for most kids that age to fully appreciate all of the historical significance of what they were seeing, it was fun to see my students "soaking in" some of it. It was also great to experience this trip with a Christian community. Our whole group would meet each morning before we began touring for devotions and prayer. It was a worthwhile trip and an experience the students will never forget.
