## Message from Pastor Mike

The twelve days of Christmas are over. I always think it would be nice if that meant winter was over as well, but that's not the way things work. Spring is still a good ways off, and Lent and Easter are "late" this year.

We are in what I like to call the Little Green Season, the Sundays after Epiphany. This has a different feel from the Great Green Season, the Sundays after Pentecost. For one thing, it's winter, not summer. That means the green on the altar does not correspond to the green of growing crops and grass.

Still, this can be a season of growth – spiritual, if

not terrestrial. God does not abandon us in the dark long nights of our lives. If anything, it is then that He can work greater and deeper faith, even in times when suffering may be strong and it is hard to see an end to pain. The Spirit can purify us even when we can't see or feel anything, so that when spring and Easter do come, we may enjoy them more perfectly.

Epiphany is a word that can also mean "revelation" or "manifestation." Or more simply, it's what I like to call having an "Aha!" moment. In the lessons during this season, we see people having "Aha!" moments –

moments when they realize who Jesus really is. Some reject Him when they find out, but many come to faith.

In these days of the Little Green Season, look for "Aha!" moments, moments when you can see the Spirit working in your life and you can grow deeper in your understanding of God and His ways.

## NOTICE OF CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

There will be a congregational meeting following worship on **Sunday, February 10th**. In accordance with the decision of the November 2018 meeting, this will serve as the annual congregational meeting for 2019.

Since a lot of the normal business for an annual meeting was covered in November, this meeting should be relatively short.

There are two important items on the agenda.

One is a report of the Call Committee as to their progress in calling a new pastor.

The second are some proposed changes to the constitution and bylaws. The constitutional changes are being presented for a first reading; they need to be adopted at the 2020 annual meeting. These changes fall into three categories:

- (a) restructuring the church council to make it smaller, and so that committee chairs will no longer (necessarily) be members of council;
- (b) simplifying and shortening the process for amending the constitution; and
- (c) changing the date for the annual meeting, so that it will consistently be held in February rather than November. A separate congregational meeting will be held in December each year for the proposed budget.

The precise language that is being proposed was distributed to the congregation via their mailboxes. However, amendments to the proposals are in order at this meeting.

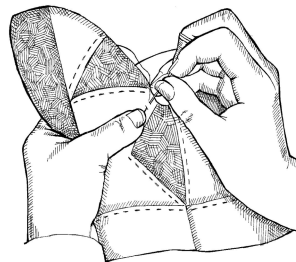

## CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES

January 8, 2019

**CALL TO ORDER:** The monthly meeting of the Cross Lutheran Church Council was called to order by President Kent McKenzie, at 7:00 PM on the above date. Members present were Kent McKenzie, Gretchen Roestel, Krisie Fritz, Norm Nelson, Mike LePage, Barb Degg, Corey Messing, Nancy Schuette and Rachel Higgins. David Faupel was present to represent the school. Mike LePage offered the opening prayer.

**AGENDA:** The agenda was presented to all present. A motion was made by Gretchen Roestel to accept the agenda as provided, seconded by Mike LePage. Motion carried.

**MINUTES:** The Council Minutes dated December 4, 2018, were reviewed by all present. A motion was made by Norm Nelson to approve the minutes as presented. Corey Messing seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**GUEST PRESENTATIONS/REQUESTS:** Paul Schuette distributed a written proposal of changes to the constitution and bylaws as discussed at the November 2018 Annual Meeting. The proposals were reviewed and Mike LePage made a motion to accept and distribute the changes as written to the con-

gregation for review and voting at the February 2019 Congregational Meeting. Barb Degg seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Kevin and Betty Grimaldi were present as observers and noted the importance of the Wednesday evening services that are currently not being held during the pastoral call period.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Copies of the Treasurer's report were distributed to all present. Barb Degg made a motion to accept the report, seconded by Krisie Fritz. Motion carried.

**COMMUNICATIONS:** Mike LePage informed the group of a request for permission to use the Cross gym when the VFW Hall is not available for exercise classes. This includes a payment of \$100 per use. Norm Nelson made a motion to allow the exercise classes to be held in the gym on these occasions with prior arrangements made. Corey Messing seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**PASTOR'S REPORT:** Pastor Mike Tamorria was not in town but communicated with council by conference call. He shared the following:

Shut ins had been contacted and received communion in December.

Confirmation class is coming along.

2 families have expressed interest in their children receiving 1<sup>st</sup> communion and he will begin instruction during religion class at school.

He is currently working with another family to schedule a baptisms.

The Call Committee has two phone interviews scheduled.

The Worship Committee discussed options of continuing to use bread baked by members of the congregation for communion verses using wafers that are purchased. The committee decided to use bread for one communion Sunday in February and wafers for the other. Then gather input from the congregation.

### **Principal's report**

David Faupel submitted a written report and highlighted that the school has received a \$1,200 robotics grant from the State of Michigan. He also reported that ongoing discussion and information gathering is underway concerning the possibility of starting a Day Care Center at the school. A preliminary licensing meeting went well and found that very little would need to be done to the building and the main costs would be purchasing equipment. The biggest challenge at this point is finishing a business plan and finding a director if the congregation should vote to move forward.

**MINISTRY OF YOUTH:** No report

**MINISTRY OF PARISH LIFE:** Nancy Schuette submitted a written report.

**MINISTRY OF PROPERTY:** Corey Messing reported that he has been changing out LED bulbs in an effort to conserve energy and he set thermostats to automatically adjust. The sump pump at the parsonage went out and has been replaced. Two exhaust fans at the school are not working and he is checking into repairing them.

Script cards will be sold January 27th with Nancy Heck and Lori Smith doing sales. The next one will be February 17 with Bonnie Schulz doing sales.

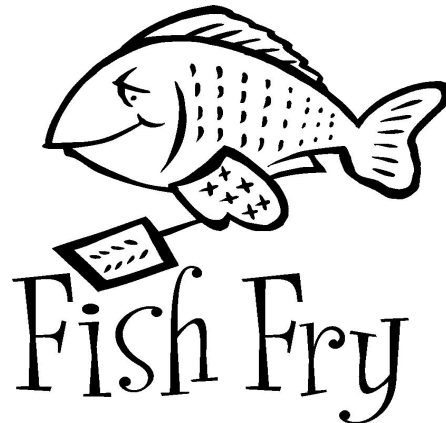
Coffee hours - March 24, April 28, May 19, September 8, October 6 and November 10. Group members in charge will be scheduled.

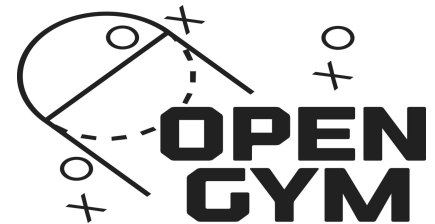
