Obituary

Donald Robert Barbret, 86, of Caseville, died Thursday, Oct. 13, 2011 at Courtney Manor in Bad Axe.

Don was born Jan. 29, 1925 in Detroit to the late Rudolph and Elsie (Lloyd) Barbret. He graduated from Denby High School in 1943. He served in the U.S. Navy during World War II and the Korean War. On Oct. 19, 1946 he married Nadene Eloise Chapman in Detroit.

From 1947 to 1972, Don worked for the Detroit Police Department before retiring as a Detective Sergeant. After retiring, he moved to Caseville. He then spent 13 years driving school bus for Elkton-Pigeon-Bay Port Schools, retiring in 1986. He was a proud life member of the Pigeon VFW Post No. 2236, often called upon to perform military honors and present the flag for a deceased veteran. He was a 22-year member of the Caseville Eagles No. 3690, where he chaired Monday night euchre. He enjoved playing bridge with the Caseville Bridge Club. He was a mem-

ber of Cross Lutheran Church in Pigeon. He also enjoyed boating and fishing. Surviving are his wife Nadene; sons, the Rev. Thomas (Marlene) of Oscoda, Robert (Sherrie) of Pinckney and James (Joan) of Saline; grandchildren, Jennifer (Mounim) Sais, Sarah (Yassine) Johri, Marcus and Kelly Barbret; great-grandchildren, Sabreen, Jonah and Jamila; and brother Edward (Bonnie) of St. Clair Shores. He was preceded in death by his brother Lloyd.

Funeral services were conducted 4 p.m. Sunday, Oct. 16, 2011 at Cross Lutheran Church in Pigeon, with the Rev. Tim Loehrke officiating. Military honors will be presented by the Pigeon VFW and Caseville American Legion. Urn interment was at Great Lakes National Cemetery in Holly. Memorials may be made to Cross Lutheran Church.

September 13, 2011

CALL TO ORDER: The monthly meeting of the Cross Lutheran Church Council was called to order by acting president, Richard Koehler, Jr., at 7:02 p.m., on the above date. Members present were Pastor Timothy Loehrke, Karen Schuette, Krisie Fritz, Kevin Trost, Paul Schuette, Ray Licht, Terry Sturm, and Nancy Heck. Guests present were Betty Champagne and Gwynne Barry. Pastor Loehrke opened the meeting with prayer.

MINUTES: The previous Council Minutes dated August 9, 2011, were reviewed by all present. A motion was made by Terry Sturm to approve the minutes, Ray Licht seconded the motion. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Copies of the Treasurer's report were distributed to all present by Nancy Heck. Nancy Heck reported that the General Fund had income of \$33,925.71 for the month of August and expenses of \$25,483.30. The General Fund balance, segmented, includes Leaf Fund -\$732.49, Roof Repair Fund -\$3,695.14, Organ Repair Fund - \$7,300.00, General Operating Fund as a Fund Balance of \$4,098.17 and the Cemetery Perpetual Care Fund has a balance of \$8,975.00. Licht makes a Motion to accept Nancy's report, seconded by Kevin Trost. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY REPORT: Paul Schuette provided his report to all present. His report covered the period of 1/1/2011 through 9/10/2011, and it showed Total Contributions for the General Fund were \$186,802.26 which is \$5,106.11 over budget. Other monies received to date were as follows:
