From the Desk of ... Wendy Zick

What a joy to be the band director! I was inspired by my band director, Mr. Nelson, to follow in his footsteps. I guess could say he you was "instrumental" in my career choice. This year we have had all but one student in 5^{th} - 8^{th} grade in the band program. Our largest group is the 5th grade; there are eight of them! We have seen progress by leaps and bounds this year and I am very proud of all the band students.

Events we have been able to participate in this year include: the Christmas Program, Music Palooza, Western Night, Thumb Friend of the Arts Solo & Ensemble Festival, and we have played in church a few times. At the time of this writing, the Jr. High band is preparing for the



Lutheran Schools Music Festival in Bay City. All band students are preparing to play Circumstance" "Pomp and which the 5th grade is making fantastic progress on. It is at the end of their book and a stretch for them. Solo and Ensemble and the Music Festival are important to participate in. They give the students a chance to display their abilities and be adjudicated with others of their age group. At TFOA the Jr. High received two "I's" and one "II", indicating to me that they are on par with public school students.

I believe in the importance of music education. It helps children to grow in so many different ways. The benefits conveyed by music education can be grouped in four categories: success in society, success in school, success in developing intelligence, and success in life (http://www.childrensmusicworkshop.com/advocacy/

benefits.html). The U.S. House of Representatives has passed a resolution recognizing the benefits and importance of school-based music (http:// beta.congress.gov/bill/108thcongress/house-concurrentresolution/380/text). MENC has a list of twelve benefits based on studies (http:// websites.msdpt.k12.in.us/ aslightom/files/2012/11/ Twelve-Benefits-of-Music-Education.pdf) Music education is very important and I am committed to ensure that children, your children, have the benefits of music education.

A band program takes a lot of work: because the students only meet with me for $1\frac{1}{2}$ hours every week I depend on them to spend time practicing independently. There is a reward program. the Band Store, where they can choose small tokens for their work. Donations to the band store are welcomed. This year students that did not have an instrument were fitted with one to use. A couple of these instruments cannot be taken home. If you have an instrument that you no longer use chances are that we can find a student that could use it. Music is so important to the students' development and it is great to be a part of it!

March 12

CALL TO ORDER: The monthly meeting of the Cross Lutheran Church Council was called to order by President, Richard Koehler, at 7:05 p.m., on the above date. Members present were Pastor Timothy Loehrke, Karen Schuette, Paul Schuette, Tom Shupe, Aileen Prill, John Smith, Lori Smith, and Krisie Fritz. Pastor Loehrke opened the meeting with prayer.

MINUTES: The previous Council Minutes dated February 12, 2013, were reviewed by all present. A motion was made by Lori Smith to approve the minutes as presented, Aileen Prill seconded the motion. Motion carried.

AGENDA: Agenda for the evening was presented to all present. Motion was made by Krisie Fritz to approve the agenda as amended, seconded by Tom Shupe. Motion carried.

GUEST PRESENTATIONS/ REQUESTS: Gwynne Barry will appear later and recommend starting a Pilot Program with the Market America Program.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Copies of the Treasurer's report were distributed to all present by Tom Shupe. Tom Shupe reported for Nancy Heck that the General Fund had income of \$28.015.40 for the month of Feb-

ruary, and expenses of \$30,787.82. The General Fund balance segmented, includes Leaf Fund \$413.59, Capital Improvement Fund 8,475.14, Organ Repair Fund \$7,300.00, General Operating Fund has a NEGATIVE Fund Balance of \$7,537.50 and the Cemetery Perpetual Care Fund has a balance of \$11,750.00. Tom Shupe made a Motion to accept the treasurer's report, seconded by John Smith. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY RE-PORT: Paul Schuette provided his report to all present. His report covered the period of 1/1/2012 through 3/12/2013, and it showed Total Contributions for the General Fund were \$51,196.15, which is \$5,536.35, under budget.

communications: A Letter was received from East Side Soup Kitchen, thanking the youth for the collection of \$251.17 to assist in feeding the hungry. They hope they can count on their assistance next year. Next year's Souper Bowl is scheduled for Sunday, February 2, 2014.

Tuition was raised \$50.00 for 1st student, if enrolled prior to August 1, 2013, the extra fee increase of \$50.00 would be waived. (School board did the same thing last year and it seemed to help get things done prior to the 1st day of school).

MINISTRY OF PROPERTY: Neil Herford was not present as he was ill.

MINISTRY OF WORSHIP AND MUSIC: Karen Schuette was present and and gave an oral report as they had not met in March.

Wednesday Night Lenten Dramas – Karen will choose 5 monologues from new source and ask people to read them. They will use the black curtain in the chancel again this year.

 Western Night – Saturday, April 13, 2013. Parish Life and Mission Outreach will do the meal and hall decorations. Karen and Beth will be meeting to plan the program. Proceeds will go to the Capital Improvement Fund.

Her Ministry will take an inventory of the pew hymnals, and see if we should look at replacing some of the old hymnals that are falling apart.

MINISTRY OF STEWARD-SHIP: Tom Shupe was present and he provided his minutes to all present. Highlights of his minutes were as follows:

Building Fund – Donations have been good to date. A final payment was made to Bay Port State Bank to pay off the balance of the building loan. There are still outstanding private loans that the church is making interest payments on.

Nancy reported that the general fund is falling behind – President Koehler will make an announcement in church. Stewardship discussed about adding the moneys collected in the bulletin each week. Aileen will create a form and have the counters sign.

Gwynne Barry presented her presentation and recommended that council allow her to start a Pilot Program with the Market America Program. Council agreed to allow the Pilot Program to go forward.

MINISTRY OF YOUTH: Pastor advised that Fish Fry went well and that 9 were signed up for summer camp. Confirmation class will do the annual retreat at Bay Shore Camp.

MINISTRY OF OUTREACH: Lori Smith was present for the meeting and provided her written report to all present. Highlights were as follows:
