Listening for the Promise

Weekly Devotional

Feast of the Epiphany — January 6, 2024

"Now after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea in the days of Herod the king, behold, wise men from the east came to Jerusalem, saying, 'Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him. " - Matthew 2:1-2 –

In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth, and since that time we have been able to see God's hand in the movement of all His creation. The stars have been used from the beginning to tell time and to recognize the order of the seasons. Along with the practical reasons for studying the night sky, changes in the stars were often interpreted as signs and omens foretelling of things happening in the world. Some magi in the East noticed the sudden appearance of a new star; they had knowledge of the promises and prophecies of Hebrew scripture and recognized that the star pointed to the birth of a new king in Israel. They traveled great distances to find the baby and worship him.

God created the heavens and earth, so it is no surprise that He would use a star to guide those wise men to Bethlehem. God is intimately involved in every aspect of His creation which he uses to manifest His promises before the whole world. The wise men followed a star that seemed to move as they moved, guiding them to the place where they would find the child. They traveled a dangerous and difficult journey to worship this new king based on a sign in the heavens.

This was a miraculous visitation, but the wonder continues as we see the gifts that the wise men delivered to the newborn king. The gold had a practical purpose; it would be used to care for Jesus in the world, especially during the escape to Egypt. The gold also represented Jesus' rule and authority as King over all God's creation. The frankincense was a sign of Jesus' ministry, a foreshadowing of his role as High Priest when He would present Himself as the perfect lamb to atone for the sins of the world. Myrrh was an expensive ointment that was used only for the anointing of the dead. We are invited to join the wise men in worshiping the Son of God, our King, Priest and Savior, the fulfillment of all God's promises.


The meeting was called to order by President, Matt Zimmerman, at 7:01 p.m.



Statement of Faith

(Approved by Church Council on 11/7/23)

We believe that the Bible, both the Old and New Testaments, is the inspired and inerrant Word of God. In addition to the Bible, only resources and teaching that align with what the Bible says should be taught. We also believe in the tenants of the Apostles' Creed.

We believe in creation; that man and woman were created by the direct act of God and in the image of God. We believe that all men are born in sin. We believe that salvation is by grace alone through faith in our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ and the shedding of His blood on the Cross as an atonement for our sins.

We believe that God ordained marriage and family as a foundational institution of society. We further believe that the only Biblically sanctioned marriage is the public union of one man and one woman. We believe that marriage is intended for a lifetime and that any sexual activity outside of marriage is sinful.

We believe that God wonderfully and immutably creates each person as a male or female human being. These two distinct, complementary sexes together reflect the image and nature of God. An individual's gender (male or female) is their unchangeable biological sex as determined by genetics at conception. The Lord teaches us in His Word that sexuality is a gift granted by God. Deviations from His perfect design demonstrate the brokenness of our world.


