SOME FINAL THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR MIKE

As I am writing this, 1 have many mixed feelings. On the one hand, there is a sense of disappointment that our prospective candidates have backed out of the call process, not quite at the last minute, but pretty close. It is a little difficult not to feel a sense of inadequacy and rejection. We do have some additional prospects, and perhaps one of them will be the pastor God is calling to Cross Lutheran. We had a setback - not quite to Square One, but maybe to Square Two.

On the other hand, I just returned from Pittsburgh, where my younger grand-daughter had her first Communion. This was a day of rejoicing and great pleasure as we shared in this event in her young life and got

to spend an afternoon with her and her sister.

On the third hand (I know that's a strange image), I am about to wrap up my Pigeon ministry in without a resolution to the call process. has been clear to me for several months now that I am unable physically to keep up with even this parttime workload, though spiritually I still enjoy the tasks of the office. I am turning 70 years old this month and. while that is still young for some folks, that's not so true for me.

So, as I said, I have lots of mixed feelings. This verse I've been drawn to maybe sums it up:

Why are you cast down, o my soul, and why are you disquieted within me?

Hope in God, for I shall again praise



Him, my help and my God. (Psalm 43:5)

Indeed, our hope is in our God, who brings life from death, speech from silence, and joy from sorrow. We all are called to trust and confidence even in the midst of all those other feelings.

I will continue to pray for you, as I hope you will for me, as we go into our futures. In the words of St. Thomas More,

Pray for me, and I for thee, and we will meet in heaven merrily.



Our junior high students recently went on a field trip to Kentucky to visit the Creation Museum and Ark Encoun-The Ark Encounter is a ter. full-size replica of Noah's Ark built to the specifications in the Bible that were given to Noah. It is huge! Both places provided a wealth of information about the first eleven chapters of Genesis for students to experience, including Creation and Students learned the Flood. that many of the things that we see in our world today show evidence of a world-wide flood and a "young" earth (about 6,000 years old, as opposed to millions of years that some scientists say). The bottom line is that we can trust that **everything** that the Bible says is true. I believe that the faith of our students was strengthened by what they saw and experienced on this "All Scripture is Godtrip. breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so

that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." 2 Tim 3:16-17.

May 14, 2019

CALL TO ORDER: The monthly meeting of the Cross Lutheran Church Council was called to order by President Kent McKenzie, at 7:05 pm on the above date. Members present were Kent McKenzie. Norm Nelson, Gretchen Roestel, Mike LePage, Barb Degg, Nancy Schuette and Rachel Higgins. Pastor Mike Tamorria offered the opening prayer.

AGENDA: The agenda was presented to all present. A motion was made by Gretchen Roestel to accept the agenda as provided, seconded by Barb Degg. Motion carried.

MINUTES: The Council Minutes dated April 9, 2019, were reviewed by all present. A motion was made by Mike LePage to approve the minutes as presented. Barb Degg seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Mike LePage also made a motion to open an operating account for the Early Childhood Development Program in the amount of \$15,000. Mike LePage, Carol Diener and the Director Sarah Brooks will be named on the account. Barb Degg seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Mike LePage made a motion that church and school staff can accumulate up to 60 days of pay for medical leave. Upon retirement, termination or resignation up to 20 days will be paid out at sub pay rate. Norm Nelson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

COMMUNICATIONS: None

PASTOR'S REPORT:

Pastor Mike Tammoria reported that 4 youth have completed all the requirements necessary for confirmation. Nancy Schuette made a motion to accept the applicants

to be confirmed on Sunday, May 19, 2019 the students are Kyle Briggs, Grace Trost, Chandler Roesenthal and Rylee Fritz. Norm Nelson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Pastor informed the council that 12 individuals are running for the NALC Bishop position that will be voted on in August 2019.

Pastor made a motion that Norm Nelson and his wife Tonja be delegates to attend the NALC gathering in August 2019. Norm Nelson accepted the invitation. Gretchen Roestel seconded the motion. Motion carried.


