¹{Jesus said,} “Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven. ⁵And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. ⁶But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.”

- Matthew 6:1, 5-6 -

“Look at me! I did good, right?” When my kids were younger, they wanted to make sure their dad and I were watching them when they did something they were proud of. Maybe they had drawn a picture or learned to ride their bike without training wheels. Whatever it was, they always looked to my husband and me for praise and approval. Children need encouragement from their parents, so it’s understandable. They’re looking for an “atta boy” or “atta girl” to boost their esteem and encourage them to keep on doing a job well done.

As God’s children, we find ourselves doing the same thing. At times, we are guilty of showing up at church, so that others will notice that we’ve come. We might want others to notice how faithful we are; we are good, little Christian boys and girls coming to worship our Father. And at times, we are guilty of praying in presence of others for the sole purpose that, once again, they’ll notice our prayers and our faithfulness. Yes, we want a pat on the back, not only from our Christian brothers and sisters, but from our Heavenly Father. We want to make our Father proud.

But do you notice what Jesus says about this in Matthew, chapter 6? These verses come from Jesus’ *Sermon on the Mount*. Jesus says that if this is the motivation behind our praying and worshiping, then shame on us! We are doing it for the wrong reasons. We don’t need to be praised, encouraged, or rewarded for our worship and prayer. In fact, Jesus says, we ought to go do so in secret. Why’s that? Because what really matters is the relationship that is strengthened through our worship and prayer. No one else needs to see or hear how well we do (or how well we *don’t* do.) The reward isn’t in some sort of praise from others. Our reward is great—even greater than praise and encouragement. Our reward is in Heaven.

Our conversations with God, our worship of God, and our praise of God will strengthen the relationship with have with our Heavenly Father. And as we spend time in prayer and worship, we are reminded of God’s promises and his greatest gifts to us: forgiveness of sin, life, salvation.



CROSS LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES

Tuesday, December 15, 2025

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by John Smith at 7:05 P.M.

Opening Prayer/Devotional: John Smith opened with prayer and devotion.

Approval of Agenda: Motion to approve the agenda made by Kevin Stachowiak, 2nd Kim Sears, Motion passed.

November Council Minutes: Motion for approval of November Minutes made by Kim Delpiere, 2nd by Kevin Stachowiak. Motion for approval of November minutes passed.

Presidents Report: NALC Conference calls.

Principal Report: The work in the gym going smoothly. Thanked John Trowbridge for heading it up.

Early Childhood Center: Motion made by Kim Delpiere to accept new contact for Miki Thick. 2nd by Al Licht. Motion Passed.

School Board: Kevin Stachowiak reported: Highlights from Cross Lutheran School Board Meeting held December 4, 2025. Whitney Peyerk is new to the Board, filling the CEA Treasurer position. It will be a very active December at the school with the Christmas Fair (Dec. 12), Christmas caroling (Dec. 16), and Christmas Palooza (Dec. 19 at 1:00pm and 6:30 pm). Christmas break is from December 22-January 2. Enrollment is steady but we will add 1 student in January. The School Board is recommending that they change school enrollment policy to a continuous enrollment format, which would be following the majority of schools in the area. A motion was made by Kim Delpiere to follow the School Board recommendation for a continuous enrollment policy. 2nd by Kim Sears. Motion passed. The School Board is also recommending that they change their \$50 Registration Fee to a \$100 Down Payment. The motion was made by Kim Sears to follow the School Board recommendation to a \$100 Down payment. 2nd by Peter Shupe. Motion passed. The School Board is recommending that they raise tuition \$50 for the first child and \$100 for each additional child for the 2025/2026 school year. That would bring our tuition prices up to the following:

Non Member : First Child \$2,600—Each Additional Child \$2,000

Member : First Child \$2,150—Each Additional Child \$1,600

The motion was made by Peter Shupe to follow the School Board recommendation for raising School tuition. 2nd by John Trowbridge. Motion passed.

Secretary: Kim Fritz not present, no known communications.

Treasurer: Kim Sears reporting starting with a beginning balance of \$142,903.11 as of 11/1/2025 and an ending balance of \$142, 942.76 on 11/30/2025. Motion to approve the treasurer's report was made by Kevin Stachowiak, 2nd by Al Licht, Motion passed.

Properties: Al Licht – Nothing to report at this time.


Worship & Music: John Trowbridge; nothing was reported

Mission Outreach: Kim Delpiere, shared report; Highlights from the Mission Outreach committee meeting held December 3, 2025.

Krisie made a motion to pay Lori S. for the Advent calendars and Christmas cards. After much discussion Kim D. made a motion to rescind the previous motion for outreach to purchase the washer and dryer for the church parsonage. The new Motion made by Maureen is that Mission Outreach would donate up to \$1,500 to the church general fund to offset the cost of the parsonage washer and dryer. The new member packets were put together. They will be stored for now, on the welcome desk and will be handed out to visitors. The OCC went well, 247 boxes were packed and shipped. The food pantry supplies was delivered. We will continue to ask for donations, because of the great need. A Clothing drive is also taking place so nice, clean clothes may be dropped off at the food pantry. Lori S. sent out 8 cards to the shut-ins for Thanksgiving and several other cards for various reasons. The outreach committee passed a motion by Kim D. to donate \$1,000 to the general fund to help with the cost of helping the electric sign communicate with the office computer. It was recommended that it be brought to Church Council for approval of the new Church Bulletins. The new Bulletins will cost \$9.99 per week. A Motion was made by Kevin Stachowiak for money to come from the general fund to pay for the Bulletins. 2nd by Kim D. Motion passed. Outreach will be hosting coffee hour December 21, 2025. Some projects for the 2026 year we are looking at. A new Mission Outreach secretary, a new membership directory, NALC collection in the Spring. Our next meeting will be January 7, 2025.

Parish Life is helping with the lunch. The program will be during the sermon time on 12/21/25. – Another Adult Bible Study will begin in January. - The church budget was passed by the members of Cross Lutheran Church.

- Bikes; 2 used bikes were dropped off at the school.
