MINISTRY OF WORSHIP AND Karen Schuette re-MUSIC: viewed her written report with everyone present. Highlights of her report were as follows: Organ will need repairs within the next five years - volume pedal and Mother Board. (Received a Cost estimate - approximately \$5,000.00). Hymnals - Karen and Pea will be working on this in the near future. Our ministry had a discussion regarding the use of the hymnal for liturgy as opposed to the weekly bulletin. They discussed the use of power point and screens to project the service liturgy. This is something to happen in the near future. Lastly, their ministry got an estimate to clean the brown chairs - it would cost approximately \$320.00 to clean and scotch guard approximately 80 chairs. Their ministry will also look into costs associated with replacing the heavy tables and chairs.

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION: Gretchen Roestel absent.

MINISTRY OF OUTREACH: Lori Smith was present and provided her written report to all present. Highlights of her report were as follows: Garage Sale approximately collected \$4,100.00. VBS - gearing up for 100 children. Our theme will be "Our Faith is Over the Top". Will need a man to drive the train and for crowd control. We received donations from Thumb National Bank, Thumb Cellular and Bank Port State Bank. We will have a Petting Zoo, 3 Jump Houses, Cotton Candy, Snow Cones, and Ice Cream and Balloons.

MINISTRY OF YOUTH: Pastor advised that Michi Lu Ca Camp

for youth is scheduled for July 7-12, 2013. Meeting was held on June 20, 2013 for camp details and going over forms and rides. Pastor and Jim Smith is looking into Wi Fi for church, back of church, and the gym.

MINISTRY OF PROPERTY: Neil Herford was present, and provided an oral report to all present.

Zimmerman Electric finished the work at Pastor's home.

Exterior Strobe and Alarm by the East Side Doors - time and materials will costs approximately \$200.00 to install.
