During a visit this summer from the missionaries of the Ebenezer Glenn Orphanage/Haiti, Mrs. Barry and Mrs. Elston were moved to "adopt" Celimene. They brought this idea to the school staff. It was decided that a portion of the weekly chapel offerings would be used to sponsor Celimene's education. Mrs. Barry has asked the sponsoring organization about other things our school may do for Celimene. She received an email that brought tears to my eyes. Following is part of that email: "Without the sponsorship Celimene would never be able to attend school. She receives a lunch meal everyday while at school. This is probably the only the meal she gets that day. Truly education is the only way that these children have even a chance to rise above that level of poverty. There is also a great need to pray for these children, both their physical needs and spiritual. Voodoo is a constant evil presence everywhere in Haiti." Reading this reminded me again of how blessed we all are. "Give thanks to the Lord for He is good."
