Message from Pastor Tim

My dear family of Cross

WOW! Summer is here and you know what that means? Our lives slow down, we relax, we go on peaceful vacations, we sit and watch the crops grow and hope the Tigers play well enough to get in the World Series or maybe the Tribe. Isn't summer great? I'm thinking not.

NRS **Psalm 46:10** "Be still, and know that I am God!

There are all sorts of music camps, sports camps, and kid retreats, and hectic vacations where we try to do everything and have to come home to rest. APRIL 14

CALL TO ORDER: The monthly meeting of the Cross Lutheran Church Council was called to order by President Tim Fritz at 7:05 PM. Members present were Kim Delpiere, Betty Champagne, Connie Eden, Tom Shupe, Pastor Loehrke, Ray Licht, Lorraine LePage, Leanne Smith, Ron Higgins, Peggy Koehler, Sue Battel and Terry Sturm. Pastor opened the meeting with a prayer.

MINUTES: The minutes of the previous council meeting were reviewed and corrections were noted.

The motion was made by Peggy Koehler to accept the minutes, seconded by Connie Eden. Motion carried.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor gave his monthly report.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT: Report given by Pastor.

SCHOOL BOARD REPORT: Report given by Terry Sturm.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Copies of the Treasurer's report were distributed to all present. . Terry Sturm moved to accept the Treasurer's report and seconded by Ray Licht. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY

REPORT: Nothing was reported at this time.

MINISTRY OF STEWARD-SHIP: Ray Licht distributed a report.

MINISTRY OF WORSHIP AND MUSIC: Report distributed to everyone present.

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION: Connie Eden distributed a report to everyone present.

MINISTRY OF OUT REACH: Report distributed to everyone present.

MINISTRY OF YOUTH: Report submitted to everyone.

MINISTRY OF PROPERTY: Report distributed to everyone.

MINISTRY OF PARISH LIFE: Report distributed to every one present.

MINISTRY OF SOCIAL SER-VICES: Report distributed to everyone present.

OLD BUSINESS: Recommendations from Ad Hoc Committee were reviewed by council.

NEW BUSINESS:

Ray Licht moved that council act on all recommendations from the Ad Hoc Finance Committee and that Tim Fritz will give a letter of recommendations to the congregation. Peggy Koehler seconded. Motion carried.

Recommendations from the Ad-Hoc Finance Committee for Cross Lutheran School.

- 1. Grades K-8 will be offered next school year 2010-2011.
- 2. Registration fee will be \$50/ child.
- Tuition for Cross member, first child \$1,100/yr. (\$100 increase from 2009-2010), each additional child \$700/yr (same as 2009-2010)
- 4. Tuition for Non-Cross member, first child \$1,350/yr (same as 2009-2010), each additional child \$800/yr (\$100 increase from 2009-2010

- 5. 25% down payment of total tuition prior to the start of the school year 2010-2011.
 - A. Method of payment through EFT, Credit Card, etc.
 - B. Install credit card machine in church office to accommodate payment of tuition and hot lunch.
- 6. Tuition assistance,
 - A. 1/3 of the total amount of tuition per family is the maximum amount awarded.
 - B. Tuition assistance will be awarded at the earliest in March of 2011 if funds are available. (fund raising, donations, etc.)
 - C. Encourage families to utilize the Script program and find sponsors within their church they attend to help pay for tuition.
- 7. Transfer \$10,000 from the endowment fund to the general fund.
- 8. Transfer \$2,500 from School Board account to the general fund.
