Pastor Loehrke opened the meeting with prayer.

**MINUTES:** The previous Council Minutes dated, June 11, 2013, were reviewed by all present. A motion was made by Nancy Heck to approve the minutes, Tom Shupe seconded the motion. Motion carried.

**AGENDA:** Agenda for the evening was presented to all present. Motion was made by Karen Schuette to approve the agenda as amended by Richard Koehler to add Cemetery under New Business, seconded by Nancy Heck. Motion carried.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Copies of the Treasurer's report were distributed to all present by Nancy Heck. John Smith made a Motion to accept Nancy's report, seconded by Krisie Fritz. Motion carried.

#### **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT:**

- Enrollment for School year 2013-2014.
- As of this date, we anticipate all students to return, and hoping to have more students enroll.
- 17 students already pre-registered for next school year, 2 of those are Kindergartners.
- Karen Peterson and Aileen Prill attended a Hot Lunch Training seminar on Tuesday, August 13, 2013 to learn about new requirements from the state within the hot lunch program. Cross' hot lunch program will be audited this year. The date of the audit has yet to be determined.
- More laptop computers are being purchased for the beginning of the school year. (6-8 laptops).
- New security system is partially installed but will be in place and operational at the beginning of the school year.

SCHOOL BOARD REPORT: John Smith was present, and gave his oral report as follows:

Gwynne Barry has decided that it would be better to order more laptops (6-8) rather than using I-Pad's for our students.

Aileen Prill now has a warning line.

- No outstanding hot lunch statements at this time.
- CEA gave \$500.00 to the general fund.

**MINISTRY OF STEWARDSHIP:** Tom Shupe gave his oral report to all present.

Stewardship reviewed the Benevolence/Special Offerings no decision was made at the meeting. They do plan on adding a  $6^{th}$  envelope for NALC. They also discussed a special offering at the door for Homeless Coalition, rather than a special envelope. Endowment fund was discussed, but no decision was made - some feel it should be dissolved and others feels it should continue. Quarterly Statements/News Letters will now be emailed to save postage.

**MINISTRY OF WORSHIP AND MUSIC:** Karen Schuette had no minutes to provide. Peg and Karen evaluated 360 hymnals -6 hymnals were pulled from the pews that were in poor condition. Beth brought 12 hymnals from her parent's church for Cross Lutheran Church. Lastly, their ministry will have a Chair Cleaning Day to clean the brown chairs. New chairs and tables are out of the question at this time.

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION: Gretchen Roestel was present – no minutes were presented. She reported that her ministry will meet on August 15, 2013 @ 5:30 p.m. – they are in desperate need of teachers.

**MINISTRY OF OUTREACH:** Lori Smith was present and provided her written report from the June meeting to all present. Highlights of her report were as follows: Outreach turned over \$3,000.00 to the Church Building Fund. Outreach is still expecting \$600.00 more from Thrivent for the Garage Sale. Approximate Volunteer time was 650 hours. VBS was a success and won the Mayor's Trophy Award in the Annual Pigeon Parade. Mission/Outreach will continue to reach out to our visitors and make them feel welcomed with a gift and a will also follow up by sending a letter or card through the mail.

#### MINISTRY OF YOUTH:

**MINISTRY OF PROPERTY:** Neil Herford was not present, and no report was given.

**MINISTRY OF PARISH LIFE:** Aileen Prill did not have minutes to provide – their ministry did not meet in the months of June and July. Highlights of her oral report were as follows: Dr. Sherry Baker will return for a workshop on September 14, from 2 to 4 p.m. The focus will be addictions, self-care and boundaries. Lastly, we are in need of hosts for coffee hours in August.

#### OLD BUSINESS:

- Safety Issues, etc... will be addressed prior to school resuming.
- Outreach Letters Council needs to continue our efforts now and in the future. Pastor will be holding a new member class in October. "Please sign cards" have been placed in pews for visitors.
- John Smith has been going over the hot water tank blue prints to determine which is the best option for the kitchen.
- Pastor's office sound proofing still needs to be addressed, window has been installed.
- Refinancing Building Fund -Stewardship will hold a special meeting on September 10, 2013 @ 5:30 p.m. to put
