Message from Pastor Tim

My dear family of Cross Lutheran.

At the beginning of May I attended the first **NALC Mission Planting** Conference in Columbus, OH. The two day conference provided numerous moments of learning, a plethora of God moments and a new sense of camaraderie with fellow Christian brothers and sisters within the NALC.

There were many thoughts I took from the conference, however, the one thought that resounded within me was the way the NALC views mission. The traditional view of mission was to reach those who have not heard of Jesus Christ and make them members of our church. In so doing there will be more people in the pews on Sunday and the offering plate will be overflowing which means our bills, building fund, budget, etc, will be met and life is good.

However, the NALC has a Christ centered approach to mission and is stated as such; make disciples not members. **Matthew** 28:19 Go therefore and

make **disciples** of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, If we have been commanded by Jesus Christ to make disciples, and he has, what then is a disciple? Disciple comes from a Latin word meaning "learner", one who follows and learns from another as a pupil.

Jesus modeled how to make disciples. He went out and called each by name to follow. NRS Matthew 9:9 As Jesus was walking along. he saw a man called Matthew sitting at the tax booth; and he said to him, "Follow me." And he got up and followed him. Jesus called 12 by name to follow and learn the grace, love, mercy, and forgiveness of God through him.

However, once the disciples had learned; they were sent. NRS Matthew 10: 5 These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: "Go nowhere among the Gentiles, and enter no town of the Samaritans. 6 but

go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. 7 As you go, proclaim the good news. 'The kingdom of heaven has come near.' The teaching of Jesus is not to be kept under a bushel. It is not to be kept iust for members of the church. The teaching of Jesus is to be spread throughout the world by making disciples who make other disciples who make other disciples and so on. The making of disciples is perpetual, never ending, always relevant, always in demand. **MRS** **Matthew**** 9: 37 Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few: 38 therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

A wise man once said that every church has a mission but does God have a church for his mission? Does God have Cross Lutheran for his mission? Our mission statement boils down to three words, BRING, TEACH, SEND. Bring people to Cross and make disciples.

Council Meeting Minutes



April 12, 2011

CALL TO ORDER: The monthly meeting of the Cross Lutheran Church Council was called to order by acting president, Richard Koehler, Jr., at 7:01 p.m., on the above date. Members present were Terry Sturm, Mike Fritz, Paul and Karen Schuette, Kevin Trost, Lorraine LePage, Ray Licht, Pastor Loehrke, Krisie Fritz, and Nancy Heck. Guests present were Mike Eden, Betty Champagne, and Gwynne Barry. Pastor Loehrke opened the meeting with devotion and prayer.

MINUTES: The previous Council Minutes dated March 8, 2011, were reviewed by all present. A motion was made by Terry Sturm to approve the minutes as presented, Ray Licht seconded the motion. Motion carried.

AGENDA: Nancy made a Motion to amend the Agenda by adding under New Business #5 - CEA requests, and under Old Business #3. -Maurer Electric Bid.

Motion was supported by Lorraine LePage. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Copies of the Treasurer's report were distributed to all present by Nancy Heck. Nancy Heck reported that the General Fund had income of \$25,229 for the month of March and expense of \$34,076.63. The General Fund balance, segmented, includes Leaf Fund -\$1,129.00, Roof Repair Fund -\$3,395.00, Organ Repair Fund - \$7,300.00, General Operating Fund as a Negative Fund Balance of \$3,074.00 and the Cemetary Perpetual Care Fund has a balance of \$8,475.00. At this time the **General Operating Fund is** borrowing from the other funds, rather than using the bank line of credit. Ray Licht made a motion to accept Nancy's report, seconded by Terry Sturm, Motion carried.

FINANCIAL SECRETARY REPORT: Paul Schuette reviewed his report for the period of 1/1/2011 through 3/31/2011, with everyone present. His report showed Total Contributions for the General Fund were \$66,972.29, which was \$1,359.79 over budget. Other monies received were as follows:

Building Fund \$ 8,030.00

Benevolence \$ 1,468.15

Other Donations \$ 250.00

Discussion continued regarding financial condition. Nancy and Paul will work together as to how to proceed of informing congregation of the Church's financial condition on an ongoing basis, as some felt that the Treasurer's report shows a better outlook than what we really have. Motion was made by Nancy Heck to accept

Paul's report, seconded by Mike Fritz. Motion carried.

COMMUNICATIONS: Communications were received from Paull E. Spring, Bishop and a Letter was sent to Bernice Shupe by Pastor Loehrke, both communications were read by the secretary, Krisie Fritz, to all present.

GUEST PRESENTATIONS/ REQUESTS: Mike Eden was present under New Business on the Agenda - Benches for Cross garden. Mike Eden presented pictures and prices to council, council felt that we couldn't commit at this time. Council felt an insert could be put in weekly bulletin to contact Mike Eden if anyone would be willing to donate a bench, possibly in honor or memory of a loved one.

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Loehrke reviewed his written report with everyone present. Highlights of his report were as follows:

Pastor had 1 Funeral, 15 Teachings, 11 Communions, 12 Hospital Visits, 19 Home Visits, 26 Meetings, and 15 Services in March.

- First Communion will be administered Sunday, May 15, 2011.

MINISTRY OF STEWARDSHIP:

Ray Licht reviewed his report with everyone present. Highlights of his minutes were Surplus money is gone due to large bills this month. Need generous

offerings to keep up with the bills.

MINISTRY OF WORSHIP AND MUSIC: Karen Schuette reviewed her report with everyone present. Highlights of her report were as follows: 2011 Variety show to be held on May 22, 2011 @ 3:00 p.m. Proceeds will go to the Building Fund. She also discussed the need to start planning for the Cross 120th Anniversary on August 21, 2011, and gave some ideas to council. Ideas were as follows:

- Expanded coffee hour in the gym with displays of many of our artifacts.
- Have the scripture read in German. (No translation necessary if English is printed in our worship bulletin.

Beth is willing to coordinate special music that day, i.e. band.

Karen's committee feels this should be a joint effort, not solely her committee. Karen also brought up a possible need for more handicap parking spaces, more coat racks or fixing the present racks.

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION:






