Message from Pastor Glenn



From the Pastor's desk at Cross Lutheran Church-NALC,

Another season of preparation, anticipation, and celebration has now passed, and we look forward to another year with renewed hope. Looking back at the past year at the way our world is changing, it would be a lot easier to ignore it by shutting our eyes and covering our faces with our hands. We may even want to plug our ears. I'm sure we can all think of a time when life was a lot simpler, safer, and slower. Today's motto for some

seems to be, "If it feels good or right, just do it." I wonder if the thought has occurred to many that just because we are able to "do it," should we do it? Just because it feels good or right to us, have we considered our neighbor or the eternal consequences?

Even though many will have taken down the ornaments and lights that filled the Advent and Christmas Season, we continue to prepare, anticipate, and celebrate Christ's promise to return to us one day. It would do us well to prepare this year by staying a little longer in the Christmas narrative, since we hear it for a very short time.

"Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly." Matthew 1:18-19

The very next verse begins with, "But as he considered these things..." For Joseph, the word "considered" doesn't seem do justice to the importance of his personal struggle. Have you ever "considered" the best answer to an important situation? Have you spent hours during the day thinking of little else? Have there been many sleepless nights thinking about the consequences of potential answers from all sides? When days or even weeks pass without a clear direction, did prayer seem like the best direction? Handing over our troubles to God lifts the burdens off of our shoulders and places it firmly on solid ground.
