My dearly beloved family of Cross Lutheran,

I have lost summer. Where did it go? I saw the calendar and the months of June, July and August go by but I do not remember spending time in those months. What is it as I mature in age that time seems to just fly by at supersonic speed? Makes me wonder and ponder the question: What is time? Who invented time? Who discovered time? Why isn't there more time?

NRS Matthew 14:23 And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone,

There is the natural order of time i.e. winter, spring, summer and fall. The natural time from planting of a seed to the blossoming and harvest. There is the natural time of life; conception, birth, toddlers, adolescences, teenagers, young adults, mid-age adults, the older gen-



eration, death. There is a natural time to eat, sleep and rest. There is the natural time of sunrise / sunset, moon rise / moon set.

NRS Ecclesiastes 3:1 For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven:

Then there is the artificial order of time created by mankind i.e. work schedule, kids school schedule, social events schedule, vacation schedule, doctor appointments schedule, workout schedule, more work schedule, etc.

NRS Mark 6:46 After saying farewell to them, he went up on the mountain to pray.

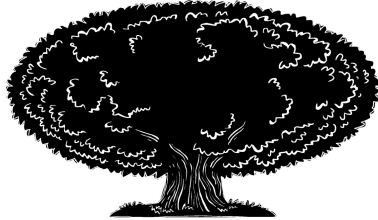
