Message from Pastor Tim

My dear family of Cross Lutheran,

Did you get any gifts for Christmas? Duh pastor!! What a ridiculous question to ask!! Of course you did. Did you get a gift with the price tag still on it? Uh Oh!! Major penalty in gift giving. Never leave the price tag on a gift.

The question is why don't we leave the price tag on the gift? Why don't we let people know how much we have spent on them? Leaving the price tag on the gift let's people know how much we love them by how much we spend on them right? After all, the focus in the gift is actually on us and how much we spend rather than the focus on the gift for the person.

Yes, gifts cost money. Yes, we can guess at how much a gift cost. Yes we can tell how much we are valued in the value of the gift being received. Yes, our feelings can be hurt if the gift we



receive is of low value. A gift can truly tell us what worth we are to others.

But now that you have been freed from sin and enslaved to God, the advantage you get is sanctification. The end is eternal life. ²³ For the wages of sin is death, but the **free gift** of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

And this gift, Jesus Christ, was given out of deep love from God. It was given by God knowing there was nothing we can do to save us from eternal death.

NRS **John 3:16** "For God so loved the world that he

gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

So as the New Year begins and resolutions are made, let all of us resolve to give the perfect gift that was given to us, not because we earned it but because out of deep love from God for us we were given it. So we too must give that to those who are around us so that free gift of salvation in Jesus Christ is made known to all.

The students got to experience hammering nails, using a drill, and sanding. When finished, they had a beautiful Nativity that they could take home with them, and they had built it themselves. You could see the pride on their faces.


