### Message from Pastor Glenn

From the Pastor's desk,

Everyone has had or will have some sort of a "mountain top" experience at least once in their lifetime. I'm talking about an event that takes your breath away. An event that has you wondering what else could ever be better than this moment. An event that makes you want to stop time right here, right now, and you would never search or want for anything more but this moment.



For the disciples, Peter, James, and John, his brother, one could say that they had experienced a 'mountain top' event both physically and spiritually in our Scripture reading located in Matthew 17 for Transfiguration Sunday. Especially Peter who must have felt that this experience was so wonderful that he said to Jesus in verse 4, "Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, and one for Moses and one for Elijah." Could it have been that Peter wanted to stop time right then and there and just live on the mountain with Jesus, Moses, and Elijah? Quite possibly so, but what may seem like a perfect plan to us, looks very foolish to God. (1 Cor. 1:25)

What happened next will drop the disciples to their knees! "...a bright cloud overshadowed them, and a voice from the cloud said, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." Upon hearing the voice of God, they fell on their faces and were terrified. "But Jesus came and touched them, saying, 'Rise and have no fear."

We as humans are always looking for that "mountain top" event. Once we believe we have found something that may seem to be the pinnacle of our life's work, we become squatters and want to claim our homestead, just like Peter. We may feel as though we've finally traveled up the rocky path to success and happiness, and now we can just forget about anything and everything around us. We no longer have the urge to move forward. We can plant the victory flag at the summit, set up our lawn chair, and live in that moment forever.

But time continues to move forward. Although we may have journeyed to the peak and wish to stay there, God has other plans. Yes, there will be a time when we must make the journey back down the mountain to reality; to the things that still need to be completed. Peter was happy on the mountain, but Jesus had many more miles to travel to complete His Father's Will. It would have been easier for Jesus to just stay on that mountain too, but in obedience to His Father, He was to journey on to Jerusalem. Not for Himself, but for us.

Maybe that is why this is a difficult time of the year for many to attend worship services during the Lenten Season. We have been on a high since

or 30th.

Christmas and now we must begin the slow descent following Jesus only to watch Him die on the cross. We have to come down from the mountain top with the disciples and Jesus to continue to do the ministry that has been set before us. Christmas was the beginning of the journey. We must not see that as the highlight of the Church year.

Many have said that they do not like the Lenten Season and especially Holy Week. Some do not attend Maundy Thursday or Good Friday services because they are so dark and depressing. They leave the church service overshadowed by sadness. And so we fail to see the bright clouds overshadowing us. We fail to hear God's voice. We fail to hear the voice that says to us, "Rise and have no fear."

Our journey from the mountain to the procession to the cross leads us to the most wonderful event in the history of humankind. God's promise is fulfilled for us. The ultimate event is eternal life, which could only happen through the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. It is a promise that we can only see clearly when we come down from high places and walk in valley of the shadow of death, into the dust that we will once again return.

Thanks be to God that He has promised something so wonderful that we can only see it by walking with Jesus to the cross. It is a long and difficult forty-day journey and its worth to us is not easily realized or seen until we reach Easter morning...


