After completing the station, the station monitor wrote a letter into the space on their passport. At the end of the day, teams had to solve a puzzle using all the letters. The puzzle answer was "Lutheran Teamwork Wins".

Impressing me most was the fellowship of the kids in their multi age groups. They were encouraging and engaged the whole day. There was

cooperation. There was leadership. It was so much fun to be a part of the event. Our Cross kids were chattering up a storm on the TAT bus as we returned to school. They had thoughtful suggestions for next year and of course, wanted more water activities! I asked if they were intimidated being in mixed teams, and they were not. They learned to work together and have fun!

Many thanks to the HISD team of Scott Whipple, Jenni Trusock, and Tyler Leipprandt, who along with the St. John's Port Hope staff, planned the event.

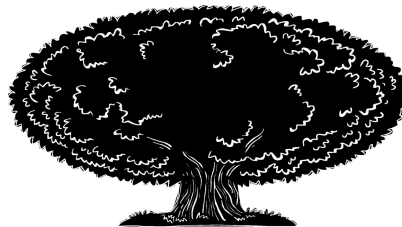
Looking ahead in the Fall: We are planning on hosting a Harvest Theme Dinner. Possibilities

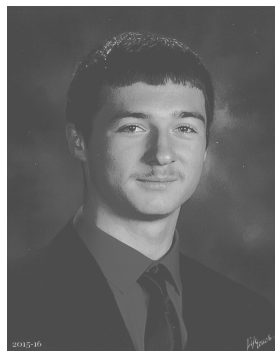

R y a n Trost, son of Michael & Laura Trost graduated from Laker High School. R y a n ' s

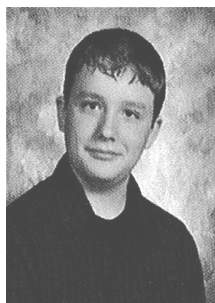

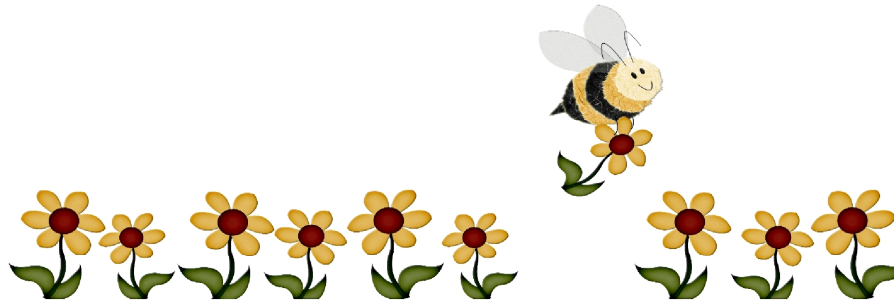
