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*“On the last and most important day of the festival, Jesus stood up and shouted, ‘If you are thirsty, come to me and drink! Have faith in me, and you will have life-giving water flowing from deep inside you, just as the Scriptures say.’ Jesus was talking about the Holy Spirit, who would be given to everyone that had faith in him.” - John 7:37-39 -*

How often do we follow a tradition without really understanding it? Christmas and Easter are celebrations of the church steeped in rich tradition. At Christmas we celebrate the birth of Jesus, in Holy Week we prepare for his death, and at Easter we praise his resurrection. But why do we observe Pentecost and what is the significance?

“Pentecost” comes from the Greek word *pentekostos* and translates as “fiftieth day.” For Christians, it marks the 50th day after Easter when the Holy Spirit descended upon a group of followers. Jesus says to the group, “If you are thirsty, come to me and drink! Have faith in me, and you will have life-giving water flowing deep inside of you.”

In Acts 2:1-4 we learn “On the day of Pentecost all the Lord’s followers were together in one place. Suddenly there was a noise from heaven like the sound of a mighty wind! It filled the house where they were meeting. Then they saw what looked like fiery tongues moving in all directions, and a tongue came and settled on each person there. The Holy Spirit took control of everyone, and they began speaking whatever languages the Spirit let them speak.”

We celebrate Pentecost as the very moment the church was formed with all its followers receiving the power of the Holy Spirit. It is the beginning of the sainthood of all believers as we are baptized into faith. We are now steeped in rich tradition with our brothers and sisters in Christ from this early establishment. We are a part of this ancient church!

Jesus invites us to follow, have faith, and receive the power of the Holy Spirit. What a powerful invitation! We can walk in the light as Jesus did and bear witness to others by sharing the Good News!

It is indeed life-giving water! Amen.

Agenda Update and Approval: Motion by Delpiere, second by Sears to approve the agenda as presented. All Ayes. Motion carried.

Review of Minutes of February Meeting

Motion by Delpiere, second by Stachowiak to approve the minutes of the February 9, 2026 meeting as presented. All Ayes. Motion carried.

Pastors Report

Pastor Kaiser submitted a written report for Council to review. Official acts were 2 Baptisms and 1 Funeral. Church Officers were installed on March 8, 2026. Motion by McKenzie, second by Shupe, to release Glenn and LouAnne Sokolowski to Glen Flora Lutheran Church, Glen Flora, Wisconsin.

#### **Staff Reports**

Principal Faupel reported the School Children will sing in Church on March 16th. March 30th thru April 6th is Spring Break. The Winter Dinner Auction raised \$72,000. Thanks to Lindsey, Rita and all who took part in the Dinner Auction. An Open House for the School, Pre School and Day Care is being planned for April 9, 2026.

#### **Officer Reports**

Treasurer Sears submitted a written financial report for February. General Fund had a beginning balance of \$154,142.01 and an ending balance of \$158,322.99. Building Fund had a beginning balance of \$12,415.41 and an ending balance of \$12,935.41. Motion by Stachowiak, second by McKenzie to approve the Treasurers Report. All Ayes. Motion carried.

Vice President Stachowiak suggested we follow the Recommendation of the 5 Year Plan Committee and appoint a Task Force to Unify the Church, School and Daycare. Motion by Heck, second by Sears to appoint Pastor Kevin Kaiser, Council President John Smith, School Board President Kevin Stachowiak, Principal David Faupel, Day Care Director Micki Thick and Daycare Board Member Erica King to the Task Force. All Ayes. Motion carried.

### **Trustee Reports**

Ministry of Properties: Trustee McKenzie reported the Property Committee is reorganizing and will meet soon.

Ministry of Worship and Music: Pastor Kaiser reported Music and Worship expect to have options and costs for the repair of the Organ by June or July. New green Altar Paraments and a Robe for Pastor have been ordered. Communion will be offered at the Communion Rail on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the Month and on Special Occasions. Holy week Services are being planned. A Breakfast is being planned for Easter Sunday, followed by the Regular Service at 9:30.

Mission Outreach Ministry: Trustee Delpiere reported \$1,270.00 was raised for Safe Place. Members of the Ministry sent Easter Cards to the Congregation. Plans are continuing for the New Church Directory and to set up a Handy Helpers Group. Pastor Kevin opened in prayer at 6:05 pm.

Matt made a motion to approve the agenda, seconded by Whitney. Motion carried.

Rita made an amendment to the minutes. The \$15,000 CD is not earmarked for anything specific but is a long term set aside fund. Matt made a motion to approve the amended minutes, seconded by Whitney. Motion carried. No guest presentations.

### **CEA President's Report:**

Youth For Christ had some risers that they were not using and donated them to the school. They are similar to what we were looking for and will not take up a lot of space to store. Matt Egan is willing to look them over to see if anything needs to be replaced (bolts, screws, etc) and will be putting backs on them. Morning with Mom is coming up in May. CEA is asking for recommendations of a service project they can do at the school this year. David is going to come up with some ideas. Ideas for the scholarship fund were discussed. There will be a budget meeting to discuss WDA funds on Tuesday April 28th @ 6pm.

### **CEA Treasurers Report:**

CEA balance as of 3/28/26 is \$73,336.23.

### **School Treasurer's Report:**

April 1 Total Balance: \$57,767.17

There is a grant coming in for robotics. David went through the budget for the year. A discussion was had about simplifying the way we create and manage the budget for the year. The discussion was tabled until we confirm what Heather and the CEA decide to use.

The need for increasing the Scholarship fund was discussed. \$3,000 is needed for the 25-26 school year. Rita made a motion to move \$2,000 from the Miscellaneous Fund to the Scholarship Fund. Whitney seconded. Motion carried. A message will be put into the bulletin about the needs for the Scholarship Fund. There was a discussion about Subsidized/Free Lunches and the option to bring cold lunch.

### **Principal/s Report:**

There will be a field trip to attend the Willy Wonka Jr performance at Lakers on Friday, April 24th. Enrollment is up by 1; we have a new 7th grader attending. Enrollment is 62.

### **Old Business:**

Walmart Delivery Tips were discussed. Katie made a motion to take \$50 petty cash out from Hot Lunch each month for delivery driver tips to be used at Marcine's discretion, not to exceed \$50 per month. Michelle seconded. Motion carried.

Safety Grant: Getting the system that can have up to 24 cameras and hold close to a year of storage. This is 5x more storage than we currently have. Kevin reported that all individuals who were invited to join the task force/committee accepted and they plan to meet once per month.

Motion to adjourn by Rita at 7:39pm. Seconded by Michelle. Motion carried.
