Message from Pastor Tim

The BLIZZARD of December 2010: WOW!!! That will truly be a winter storm to go down in the history books for the Thumb. There were many travelers stranded along the roads in whiteout conditions. Stories of not being able to see the road or following the person in front caused disoriented people to follow others right into a ditch or worse yet into another car stranded along the road. Even though one knew the way it seemed very easy to veer left or right thinking one was on course the whole time not knowing the eventual catastrophe that was in store.
