Message from Pastor Glenn



From the Pastor's desk at Cross Lutheran Church-NALC,

Many people I've talked in the past few weeks have mentioned that they are ready for warm and comforting weather. This Monday morning's snowfall quickly changed the appearance of the landscape outside by completely covering the ground. People living in the Upper Midwest know that it is the time of year when we must prepare for what each day brings. One day may be tee-shirt weather and then the next day (or sometimes the next hour!) may be flannel shirt weather.

As a college instructor, I would smile as I looked out the classroom window to see students walking toward the school leaning forward in the blowing wind and falling snow to begin their day. While many would be bundled in thick coats with caps and hoods covering their heads, occasionally one student would be moving a little faster toward the building than the others. Clothed only in a light jacket, tee shirt, shorts, and sandals (and yes, no hat!), I marveled at the trust they had in others as they hurried inside, taking it for granted that the building was going to be open and warm. Noting their faith, I could imagine what they must be feeling as they were exposed to outside elements, and what a wonderful feeling it must have been for them to enter the warm and inviting environment of the school. I've often wondered how the students would react if they tried to open the door to the school and found that the door did not open! Especially those who had not prepared for the unexpected.

But what if...we tried to open the door to the church building and found that the door would not open. That warm and inviting environment that we have always known to be open for weekly worship services was not accessible. For many that have put their trust in other things, it would be like standing in a snowstorm wearing a tee shirt, shorts, and sandals.

At a time when we would like to once again gather together in faith, praying for comfort and peace, we cannot. The church doors have always been open to our comings and our goings are now closed, but do we just give up and let go of our faith in God? We have heard over and over again that Christ's church is not brick and mortar, which is true! Christ's church is Christian brothers and sisters together in one body, Jesus Christ! Wherever you are sheltered on this day that the Lord has made, we are still the body of Christ in faith!

Brothers and sisters in Christ, we will celebrate Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday regardless if we gather together inside Cross Lutheran Church or not. During this Season of Lent, we continue to prepare for Holy Week. We know what is coming next. We look to and prepare ourselves for Easter Sunday, the Day of the Resurrection!

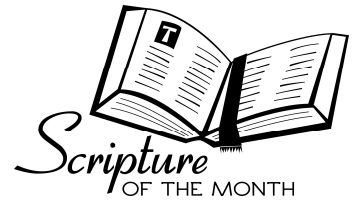

From the Desk of ... Beth Elston

Good As New, a delightful picture book by Barbara Douglass, tells the story of a seemingly hopeless situation that actually turns out better than could have been imagined. One of the few children's books that I have included in the preschool curriculum over many years (since 1992!), the story has proven timeless by captivating the attention and imagination of each group that has heard it read.

It seems that, while Grandpa and Grady were minding their own business, a demanding cousin K.C. mistreated Grady's teddy bear to the point that it was left filthy, torn and soaked through with mud. Everyone in the household resigned the bear to the trash, except for Grandpa, who quietly set about making the bear "good as new" by scrubbing it, pulling out the stuffing, and even accidentally tearing off the ears. As the bear kept looking worse through Grandpa's "fixing," Grady protested repeatedly that maybe this was not the way for Grandpa to fix the bear. Of course, patience and perseverance were eventually rewarded with a revived bear and a grateful Grady, who, in a loving response to Grandpa, proclaimed the bear "better than new!"

We can draw spiritual parallels to this story in our current events. It is a very strange feeling for students and teachers to be separated, for gatherings to be canceled, and for public places to be closed. We may feel like our "bear," or our familiar way of life, is ruined. We may, like Grady, protest that maybe God doesn't know the best way to fix this bear. We may let worry set in as we see the bear looking worse for a time, even as God is making changes.



I am reminded of a song that our choir sang recently, entitled, "Footsteps." In it, God gently says, "Trust me more." How perfect. This is exactly the word of counsel and comfort we need now. So let us replace our angst with trust and true thankfulness for God's providence, and let us rejoice that God is making our hearts "better than new."

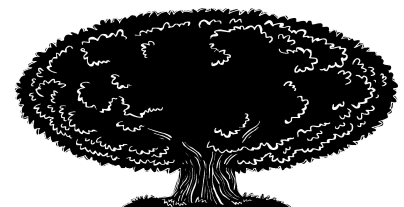

What a delight to see God's hands and feet working through the service of His people. The Father of heavenly lights does not change!

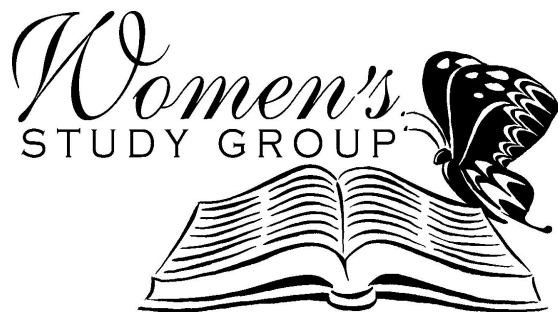
