
## Message from Pastor Tim



SCHOOL BOARD REPORT: John Smith was present, and gave his oral report. The school is doing well financially. Scholarship monies on hand total \$6,000.00, and the other monies collected from Cross Alumni is in the amount of \$20,000.00. Due to the amount of the funds, the endowment fund should be addressed again by the Stewardship Ministry.

**MINISTRY OF STEWARD-SHIP:** Tom Shupe provided his report to all present. Highlights of his report were as follows: Proposed Benevolence Schedule for 2014 was reviewed and discussed, no final decisions were made at

their last meeting. Building fund has a good balance of \$10,428.00 as of April 23, 2013. MINISTRY OF WORSHIP AND

MUSIC: Karen Schuette reviewed her report with everyone present. Highlights of her report were as follows: Organ soft and loud "boxes" may need attention soon. The piano is in need of tuning, Beth will schedule when necessary. Council has asked their ministry to evaluate the hymnals that need replacement. Karen and Peg will be working on this in the near future. To replace the old hymnals, they thought they could ask members for donations or if they had any at home they could donate for use in the pews. Lastly, their ministry felt that the brown chairs need to be cleaned. Pea will check into the cost of cleaning and Karen will speak to Neil Herford regarding this.

**MINISTRY OF EDUCATION:** Gretchen Roestel absent.

MINISTRY OF OUTREACH: Lori Smith was present and provided her written report to all present. Highlights of her report were as follows: Mom to Mom sale will be held on April 28, 2013. Garage Sale overview was given by Lorraine LePage and preliminary plans were made. Lori is filling out paperwork for Thrivent Matching Funds. Krisie Fritz would be contacting Thumb Industries for a pickup after the garage sale. Drop off schedule was planned for this event. VBS was briefly discussed, and the Smith's will need assistance Thursday evening after the VBS program to build a float for the Pigeon Parade.

MINISTRY OF YOUTH: Pastor advised that Michi Lu Ca Camp for youth is scheduled for July 7-12, 2013. Pastor is reviewing movies for Family nights.

MINISTRY OF PROPERTY: Neil Herford was present, and provided an oral report to all present.

A shrub needs to be removed. Neil will discuss with Mike Eden.

Air conditioning - Neil wondered if there was a way to maintain a constant temperature in the sanctuary.

Coat racks were installed in the connector hallway by gym.

Thermostat covers installed.

Neil fixed a swing on the playground.

Release system will be finished before next school year.

Exterior strobe light and alarm still needs to be addressed.

Neil presented council with a handout regarding the inspection done on the parsonage. The urgent item on the list was an electrical issue found in the attic that should be addressed as soon as possible. After a lengthy discussion, Tom Shupe made a motion to hire an electrician and have the electric issue resolved in Pastor's attic. Karen Schuette seconded the Motion. Motion carried.

**MINISTRY OF PARISH LIFE:** Aileen Prill provided her minutes to all present. Highlights of her minutes were as follows: Loons Game is Friday, June 21, 2013, sign-up sheet is available, tickets are \$9.00. Betty Champagne will contact Dr. Baker to arrange a date for the next workshop in September (23 people attended the last workshop). Aileen also stated that 7 people attended Adopt a Highway, and collected 3 bags of garbage.

For an endowment fund to work properly there needs to be a much greater balance on hand. Given the financial difficulty in our church it is hard to ask for donations to this fund. No decisions were made at this time.
