Message from Pastor Glenn

From the Pastor's Desk,

Each year during the Seasons of Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany, the majority of holiday planning seems to include a fair amount of traveling. Some may leave for short vacations to warmer climates and some may wish to stay a little longer as 'snow birds'. Some may be on break from school or work schedules and wish to return to family and friends to be "home for the holidays." There are always local school programs and concerts, as well as seasonal community activities happening, so we really don't think twice




about packing a few things and jumping into our vehicles to drive somewhere. In a way, it's like "dashing through the snow, in a one horse open sleigh," because "over the river and through the woods to grandmother's house we'll go!" During this time of year, traveling to see friends, family, and neighbors reconnects relationships to the people we love and those who also care and love us.

As we hear the Christmas narrative of the birth of Christ, here too, there is news of a lot of traveling going on. Luke 2 tells us that, "In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered...and so Joseph went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem." Since Joseph was from the house and lineage of David, he took Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. Most of the pictures we see of Joseph and Mary traveling to Bethlehem show Mary riding on the back of a donkey, but nowhere in Scripture is there any mention of a donkey or any other method of transportation for either Joseph or Mary, who was soon to give birth. It may have been quite possible that much of their traveling was completed on foot. Soon after they arrived, Mary "gave birth to her firstborn and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger..."

"And in the same region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night." An angel of the Lord appeared to them and brought "good news of great joy that will be for all the people." Being a shepherd was not one of the most honored vocations, but a Savior who is Christ the Lord was a Savior for everyone, even a lowly shepherd. Here the angels even gave them detailed directions to go to the city of David and even a description; "you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." Specifically chosen to receive this message from the angels, the shepherds traveled to "see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us. And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them."

In the Season of Epiphany, we hear of wise men who had traveled from the east to Jerusalem saying, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews? For we saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." They were told that the prophet, Micah, spoke of Bethlehem, in the land of Judah. This is where they

would find the Christ child. "...they went on their way. And behold, the star that they had seen when it rose went before them until it came to rest over the place where the child was." Having seen the child and offering their gifts of gold and frankingense and myrrh, they were warned in a dream about King Herod and returned to their home country by another route.

When they had departed, an angel appeared to Joseph instructing him to take the child and his mother and flee to Egypt for their safety because King Herod wished to destroy the child. Later, when Herod died, Joseph was once again visited by an angel and instructed to return to the land of Israel to a place in the district of Galilee to a city called Nazareth. This would fulfill the prophesy that, "He shall be called a Nazarene."

Wherever our travels take us during this new church year and new calendar year, may we be reminded that the good news once shared by the angels has not changed in over 2000 years. Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, is still good news of great joy that will be for all people.

CROSS LUTHERAN COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES

December 10, 2019

CALL TO ORDER: The monthly meeting of the Cross Lutheran Church Council was called to order by President Kent McKenzie at 7:10 pm. Members present were Kent McKenzie, Mike LePage, Pastor Glenn Sokolowski, Nancy Schuette, Gretchen Roestel, Krisie Fritz, Norm Nelson, Barb Degg and Rachel Higgins. Guests were David Faupel and Sarah Brooks. Pastor Glenn Sokolowski opened the meeting in prayer and shared a devotional message after reading James 5:7-11.

AGENDA: The agenda was provided to all present. Two items were added to the agenda. A motion was made by Gretchen Roestel to accept the agenda with alterations, seconded by Barb Degg. Motion carried.

MINUTES: The Council Minutes dated November 12, 2019 were reviewed. A motion was made by Norm Nelson to approve the minutes as presented. Krisie Fritz seconded the motion. Motion carried.

GUEST PRESENTATIONS/ REQUESTS: Kyle & Vicki Yackle, John Smith and Joyce Jarvis were present to ex-

press concerns about the direction of the contemporary worship services. There were many questions and conversation about how and why specific music is chosen, who will be leading these decisions, equipment purchases, and set up/location of equipment and singers. After much discussion on multiple issues it became clear that intentional communication will need to take place with members serving the contemporary style service, members serving the traditional style service, and Pastor Glenn. Recommendations of having joint meetings to encourage communication and resolve issues were voiced and seemed agreeable to most. Pastor Glenn encouraged further discussion with anyone wanting to meet with him privately.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Copies of the Treasurer's report were distributed to all present. Motion was made by Krisie Fritz to approve the report as presented. Gretchen Roestel seconded the motion. Motion carried.

COMMUNICATIONS: None

PASTOR'S REPORT: Pastor Glenn Sokolowski reported that he had held 1 baptismal instruction class, performed 1 baptism (Taylor Ann Licht), presided over 2 funeral services (Suzanne Schulze and Ray Buchholz) and 2 graveside committal services, worked at Cross Robotics Tournament, participated in the Community Thanksgiving Service, involved with the new

sign tutorial twice, toured Scheurer Long Term Care facility, weekly participation in Wednesday the morning school chapel services. opened doors for a personal party in the gym, preparing for 8th grade Confirmation Classes, will be teaching Religion Class twice weekly to the 6 -8th grade class, preparing for the New Member Classes to start in January, attended Worship and Music meeting, Parish Life meeting, Mission Ministry meeting, and Altar Guild meeting, as well as mulphone conversations, home visits and office visits: both scheduled and drop-in.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

David Faupel reported that the robotics tournament on Friday, Nov 22nd was very successful and many new people were in attendance at our facility.

The Christmas Fair for students is Friday, December 13, 2019.

Sarah Brooks reported that there will be a focus on marketing in the upcoming year to fill vacancies.

There is currently research taking place for technology to enhance communication with parents of the daily activities at the center. Currently communication is mostly through paperwork.

The Early Child Care Center will be closed December 24 – 27 and New Year's Eve and New Year's Day.

MINISTRY OF STEWARD-SHIP: Norm Nelson gave a report of benevolence contributions.

MINISTRY OF WORSHIP AND MUSIC: Barb Degg reported that security was a concern discussed at the monthly meeting and would like to look at options to make sure the building is secure during worship services.

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION: No Report

MINISTRY OF **MISSION** OUTREACH: Krisie Fritz submitted a written report. She also highlighted that the ministry would be purchasing \$10 gift cards to the local grocery store to be included with 31 baskets being distributed through the Food Pantry for Christmas.

MINISTRY OF YOUTH: No report

MINISTRY OF PARISH LIFE: Nancy Schuette submitted a written report. She noted that the church directory has not been updated since 2016 and now that our new pastor is in

place this may be a good time to have a new directory made.

MINISTRY OF PROPERTY: No report

OLD BUSINESS:

• Kent McKenzie reported that snow removal for the sidewalk areas has been contracted through Esch Landscaping to ensure walkways are cleared and safe from snow and ice.

The new electronic sign is in-

stalled and training is taking place for staff.

NEW BUSINESS

Glenn Pastor inquired about a current hard copy book for church registry of baptisms, weddings and funerals. Further research will take place as to when documentation of a written form ended as currently all record keeping is done in the computer on a program called Shepherd's Staff.

Pastor Glenn noted that there is not clear revision of language concerning the marriage policy and facility usage policy in the church constitution. He suggested this issue as well as a few others will need to be addressed to accommodate the recent change to having Trustees on Church Council rather than Ministry Leaders.

combined meetings to encourage communication and more continuity in being able to incorporate the music into worship services.
