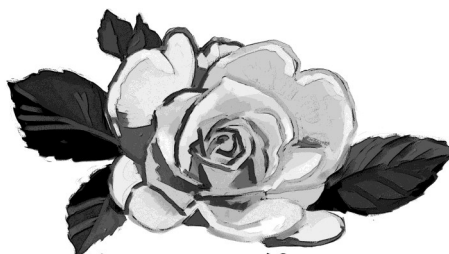

Cross Lutheran School is in alignment with the benchmarks and standards of the Michigan Curriculum Framework and guidelines of the Huron County Core Curriculum and is accredited with the Michigan Association of Non-public Schools (MANS).

The curriculum includes a religion course which is taught not only as a separate subject but as a way of life which permeates the entire curriculum of language arts, social studies, mathematics, science, music, physical education, art, technology education, etc.

Cross Lutheran School prides

itself on shaping the futures of children by providing a foundation for a Christian lifestyle through an educational environment. Each child experiences the grace, love, mercy, and forgiveness as a child of God. Focus is also on personal development with 17 Christian life skills taught to make each child a well rounded individual prepared for life beyond the classroom.

Small class sizes mean that no child is lost in the shuffle. Each receives personal attention and instruction. Because of the small class sizes and the emphasis on Christian values, discipline problems are minimal. "Put downs" and inappropriate behavior both language, and attitude, are not tolerated.

Another benefit of a small school is that it is "Cool to be Smart." Graduates of Cross Lutheran School have a proven track record after moving on to public high school.

The cost of educating children continues to escalate. It has been determined that the cost of educating each child at Cross Lutheran School amounts

to over \$4,600 per student. Tuition rates, however, are kept very low through generous support from Cross Lutheran Church's membership, which supports the school both financially and spiritually. An active CEA organizes fund raisers to also offer financial support.

Church Council Minutes



May 13

CALL TO ORDER: The monthly meeting of the Cross Lutheran Church Council was called to order by President, Richard Koehler, Jr., at 7:08 p.m., on the above date. Members present were Pastor Timothy Loehrke, Nancy Heck, Karen Schuette, Paul Schuette, Krisie Fritz, Tom Shupe, Lori Smith, Neil Herford, Aileen Prill, and John Smith. Gretchen Roestel was absent. Guest: Carol Diener. Pastor Loehrke opened the meeting with prayer.

MINUTES: The Council Minutes dated April 8, 2014, were reviewed by all present. A motion was made by Nancy Heck to approve the minutes as presented, Aileen Prill seconded the motion. Motion carried.

AGENDA: Agenda for the evening was presented to all present. Motion was made by Tom Shupe to approve the agenda with adding Discussion for Financing the Parsonage immediately following the Treasurer's Report, seconded by Neil Herford. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Copies of the Treasurer's report were distributed to all present. Tom Shupe made a Motion to accept Nancy's report, seconded by John Smith. Motion carried.

Nancy Heck and Carol Diener made a presentation regarding the financing for the parsonage. After much discussion, **Tom Shupe made a Motion to present to the congregation for a vote on May 25, 2014, to borrow up to \$500,000.00 for a construction loan from Thumb National Bank at 3.25% for one year, and 2.75% for a 5 year balloon on a 20 year mortgage. The construction loan will consist of \$250,000.00 for the proposed parsonage and to add \$225,000.00 for the repayment of the private school loans. Karen Schuette seconded the Motion. Motion carried. A second Motion to present for a congregational vote on May 25, 2014, was made by Neil Herford to authorize the President and Treasurer to sign the loans at Thumb National Bank. John Smith seconded the Motion. Motion carried.**

FINANCIAL SECRETARY REPORT: Paul Schuette was present, and provided his report to all present. His report covered the period of 1/1/2014 through 5/13/14, and it showed Total Contributions for the General Fund were \$96,015.32, Budgeted Needs were \$-16,523.14.

The custodian position was offered to Rachel Higgins, and she has accepted the position. This position offered to her is a contract job, and will be paid in the amount of \$17,640.00 annually. She will receive no insurance and no pension from Cross. She can hire anyone under her, but Cross must do a background check on each employee that she might have working for her. Karen Schuette made a Motion to hire Rachel Higgins, seconded by Thomas Shupe. Motion carried.

Also, there has been a request to apply for a Menards Credit Card and Cross will receive a 2% discount. It has been recommended by Richard Koehler to have the Building Fund Secretary, Cindy Buchholz, authorized to apply and sign, and then to give authorization to Pat Azarovitz and Ronald Schulz for authority to purchase construction materials with the use of this credit card. Motion made by Thomas Shupe to authorize per the above request, seconded by Neil Herford. Motion carried.
