Message from Pastor Mike

WELCOME TO A NEW YEAR



We live by a number of calendars. different Our secular calendar begins on January 1 and runs through December 31. The liturgicalendar begins with the first Sunday in Advent, this year December 2, and concludes with Christ the King Sunday (or the following Saturday, actually), which will be November 30, 2019.

But I suspect that a calendar that influences our lives even more, though perhaps unawares, is the school year calendar. This begins roughly on Labor Day and continues through the following August. Labor Day is in American society counted as the end of summer, and the next day is the one in which

we resume many of our normal work activities, even if we don't have children of school age.

In the church, although we observe the secular and liturgical calendars, this is true as well. Many of our activities and committees do their main work from September through May, and then "take the summer off."

At Cross Lutheran, we of course have a parochial school, and its calendar influences us greatly. Classes actually begin on August 27.

Sunday School and confirmation classes resume, however, on September 9, and this is what we know as Rally Day. At our worship that morning we will emphasize the educational ministry of Cross Lutheran in three separate ways:

1. We will install our new parochial school teacher, Carrie Ward, and her aide, Liz Kuhl, with prayer and the laying on of hands.

- 2. We will ask God's blessings on our other parochial school teachers, our Sunday School teachers, and public school teachers and staff.
- 3. We will invite all students, from kindergarten to graduate school, to bring their backpacks and receive prayer and blessing at the start of the school year.

We'll be off and running with this new year! Join us for this special opening and prayer time on September 9! Bring your backpacks!

MISSIONARY KATHLEEN LUTZ IS COMING TO CROSS

We are eagerly looking forward to having missionary Kathleen Lutz come to Cross Lutheran **September 23-24.** Kathleen has been serving in Nairobi, Kenya since 2009. She is a native of Auburn, Indiana and served in the US as a deaconess before entering global missions.

Kathleen is affiliated with WMPL (World Mission Prayer League) which is a partner organization of the NALC. Although the NALC has a few of its own missionaries, its main mechanism for funding missionaries through WMPL. WMPL was founded in the 1930's as an independent pan-Lutheran organization devoted to sponsoring missionaries

around the world. They currently have over 100 missionaries in the field. Kathleen is in the US for her periodic home leave.


She will be preaching at the Sunday morning worship service and also will be available for the Sunday School time. On Monday she will visit Cross School and meet with the various classes.

Kathleen's work is divided into three areas. The first is working with an orphanage and with street children in Nairobi. This program, known as Heart to Heart, also operates a school for these children who would otherwise have no educational opportunities.

The second area is reaching out to the nomadic tribes in the rural areas, bringing them the Gospel

and providing Bibles in the various native languages. The third is helping develop the deaconess program for the Kenyan Lutheran Church.
