He does not hunt (yet), but has lots of experience cooking for hunters, even helping a few young hunters learn to enjoy the venison they will harvest.

Pr. Kevin is married to Steffany, whom he met while serving her church in Republic, MI. They married in 2014, and their son William was born in 2015. Steffany holds degrees from Suomi College in Hancock, MI and the University of Wisconsin, Stevens Point. She most recently worked as a fitness center housekeeper and volunteered as Calvary's Sunday School teacher and Vacation Bible School director. She loves to work and volunteer in ways that are out of the spotlight. She is also the only one in the family who is a devoted fan to a professional sports team. (Go Red Wings!) William will enroll at Cross Lutheran School as a 4<sup>th</sup>-grader. He enjoys basketball, karate and playing Roblox. Their household has recently grown to include Priscilla Martti (Steffany's mom), and Alex (the family dog). ## Greetings Cross Lutheran Church!

My name is Jenny Turner and I am the art teacher here at Cross Lutheran School. This is my 4th year teaching at Cross, but I have been teaching art in some way or another, off and on, since 2000. Cross students see me on Mondays and Wednesdays either in their classroom or the gym. We explore all kinds of projects, mediums, and art concepts, and if you are a parent, you have seen some of these projects come home with your student. I wanted to share why art is important in the classroom, both academically and spiritually.

Art involves using both sides of the brain. The right brain, which is considered our creative brain, uses skills like visualization, imagination, and emotions. Students can watch their ideas come to life or just “play” with colors and mediums, such as paint, to show how they may be feeling. Our left side of the brain, or our logical brain, also contributes to art education by using skills such as logic and sequencing, which leads to observation, problem-solving, and critical thinking. Students have to make decisions along the way to make their artwork come together, many times by trial and error. Art in education provides academic excellence, leading to fewer discipline problems, higher attendance, graduation rates, and better test scores. It also boosts confidence by giving students a safe space to experiment and take risks. It teaches students to appreciate concepts and ideas from many cultures and people groups, which gives them a sense of empathy and a platform for discussions of differing ideas. Art often encourages collaboration, cooperation, and communication when students have to work together to create a project. Furthermore, art allows for creativity, a vital skill in the workforce and everyday life.

Creativity is what leads me to the spiritual importance of art. The book of Genesis tells us that God created all things. I think Christians can agree that God is the ultimate creative creator. The human body alone shows off his creativity and imagination. The thought he put into how our bodies work—the interconnectedness and many intricacies—display his power and glory. Genesis 1:27 says, “So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them.” This verse tells us that we were made in God’s image and because of this, we can conclude that we, too, were made to create. God valued creativity so much that in Exodus 31:1-5, it tells us that the first person given the Holy Spirit was an artist. His name was Bezalel and he was filled “with the spirit of God, with wisdom, with understanding, with knowledge, and with all kinds of skills—to make artistic designs” when building the Tent of Meeting and the Ark of the Covenant. Creativity comes in many forms, from fine art, singing, dancing, composing, woodworking, gardening, sewing, baking and many more. I believe that God gives us the ability to create to provide another connection between him and ourselves. It is a connection we can use not only as an act of service to others, but also an act of worship to the Lord. This is why art and creativity are so important to instill in our students at a young age, while they are without inhibitions or the fear of failure. They can feel the power and love of God while they are creating, whether they are conscious of it or not. As an artist, I would also encourage you as a church body to explore your creative side and feel the connection and closeness that you have with your Creator. Think of where your creative strengths lie (and you all have them) and use your creative time as a personal time of **worship**, just as you would singing or praying. No one even needs to see what you do.
