Message from Pastor Tim

My dearly beloved family of Cross Lutheran Church.

There are many events that have taken place in the course of mankind history. Some of these events were small in nature and their effects were short lived. Other events were very significant and their effects were felt for a long time. Then there are those events that took place that changed the world forever.

One such event took place on October 31. 1517 when a Roman Catholic Augustinian monk nailed a piece of paper on the doors of Wittenberg University, Germany. On this paper were 95 thesis, arguments, this monk had concerning several questionable practices of the Roman Catholic Church one of which was the sale of indulgences which, when brought, would reduce the time of a loved one, or themselves, in purgatory. Thus started "The Reformation" movement. A movement that turned the world back then upside down and is still doing the same today in the Religious community and secular cultures around the world. That

little unknown Augustinian monk, Martin Luther.

For 500 years, that moment in time, that one little insignificant event of someone nailing a piece of paper to the doors of a university, literally shook the world to the very core of its foundations in how God is to be worship. From fearing, i.e. to be afraid of God, in worship to a loving, graceful and merciful God; where our salvation is found in Jesus Christ through faith. Where did Martin Luther discover this? He went back to the basics. He went back to scripture. He went back to Jesus Christ. He did this so that the Roman Catholic Church would do the same. It was his intent to inform Pope Leo X of the misguided ways of the Church and to go back to scripture and follow Jesus Christ. Luther never wanted to start his own denomination but to bring his beloved Roman Catholic Church back to scripture. However, the Reformation took off like wild fire and as they say, "the rest is history." And to this day, 500 years later, that one



little insignificant event rings loud and clear.

There was another event that took place that continues to touch every single life throughout the world today whether people realize it or not. That event happened some 2,000 years ago. That event, The Passion of Jesus Christ. From Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday. the events that took place in Jerusalem to Jesus Christ during that week have impacted the world more than the Reformation has.

Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, ¹⁵ that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. ¹⁶ "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. ¹⁷ "Indeed, God

did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him.

The Passion of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ provided the path for forgiveness of sins, i.e. the cross. That weeklong event also provided the path to eternal life, i.e. the empty grave. That event also confirmed the importance of our baptism into Jesus Christ which connects us to him so that we too will go to the Cross, but also to the empty tomb as Jesus did to eternal life through our faith in him.

This we celebrate every Sunday. We give thanks and praise to Jesus Christ, and only him, for giving us the path for our salvation and eternal life through faith. For as Paul writes to the Romans:

Romans 5:1 Therefore. since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, 2 through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God.
